SEC ADVISES COURT ABOUT CAMPEAU CORPORATION TENDER OFFER

General Counsel Daniel L. Goelzer yesterday announced that the Commission submitted a letter to the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, in response to the court's request for the Commission's views, in litigation concerning Campeau Corporation's tender offer for Federated Department Stores, Inc. The Commission's letter advises the Court that, if and when Campeau obtains firm commitments for all or substantially all of the remaining financing it needs to complete its tender offer, it will have to provide shareholders with at least five business days in which to consider that change, and will have to extend the offer if it is due to expire less than five business days after the financing is obtained. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDING INSTITUTED AGAINST THE E. F. HUTTON GROUP, INC.

The Commission instituted an administrative proceeding under Section 15(c)(4) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 charging The E. F. Hutton Group, Inc. with failing to comply with Sections 13(b)(2)(B) and 13(a) of the Exchange Act and Rules 12b-20, 13a-1, and 13a-13, and Regulation S-X in connection with certain internal accounting controls deficiencies and Hutton's failure to disclose loss contingencies relating to Hutton's marketing of tax exempt industrial revenue bonds known as "upper floaters."

Simultaneously, the Commission accepted Hutton's offer of settlement in which Hutton, without admitting or denying the matters, consented to an Order requiring it to: comply with Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act and Rules 12b-20, 13a-1, and 13a-13, and Regulation S-X; include, in its 1987 Annual Report on Form 10-K, an explanation of the issues discussed in the Order; and to attach a copy of the Order as an exhibit to a Current Report on Form 8-K to be filed with the Commission. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

WILLIAM H. MELHORN DISGORGES ASSETS

The Atlanta Regional and Miami Branch Offices announced that on March 16 William H. Melhorn of Fort Myers, Florida, following a disgorgement order entered against him, surrendered assets valued at \$89,800 to the receiver appointed by the Court. Included in the disgorgement were a ten carat diamond ring and numerous gold coins. Melhorn previously surrendered the proceeds from the sale of a boat and condominium and an IRA account. Melhorn was formerly the chief executive officer of Charles Phillip Elliott, doing business as Elliott Enterprises, an unincorproated business with offices in Fort Myers and Naples, Florida.

The Court previously entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction which permanently enjoins Melhorn from violating the antifraud and registration provisions of the securities laws.

The Complaint, filed on March 31, 1987, alleges that Melhorn and others, among other things, sold unregistered securities, operated an unregistered broker-dealer, and obtained funds from investors by misrepresenting and omitting material facts regarding the investments. (SEC v. Charles Phillip Elliott, et al., SDFL, Civil Action No. 87-12012-CIV-HOEVELER). (LR-11686)

MOKAN PRODUCTS, LTD. ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on March 17 Judge Joseph E. Stevens, Western District of Missouri, entered an Order of Permanent Injunction against Mokan Productions, Ltd. The Order was entered by default for Mokan's failure to answer or otherwise appear in the lawsuit. The Order enjoins Mokan from violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. According to the Complaint, Mokan and David G. Riggs, its President, violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws by overstating Mokan's revenues and its backlog of incomplete projects in an S-18 registration statement. (SEC v. Mokan Productions, Ltd. and David G. Riggs, WDMO, No. 87-1111-CV-W-8, filed December 16, 1987). (LR-11687)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MONTGOMERY ACCEPTANCE CORPORATION

An order has been issued amending a prior order exempting Montgomery Acceptance Corporation, formerly Oxford Acceptance Corporation, from all provisions of the Investment Company Act in connection with the issuance and sale of mortgage-backed securities and equity interests. An order has been issued exempting Montgomery Acceptance Corporation IV, formerly Oxford Acceptance Corporation IV, from all provisions of the Investment Company Act in connection with the issuance of collateralized mortgage obligations by limited partnerships that Applicant may form and the sale of beneficial ownership interests in such limited partnerships. Another order has been issued exempting Applicant from all provisions of the Act in connection with the issuance of collateralized mortgage obligations by one or more trusts and the sale of beneficial ownership interests in such trust or trusts. (Rel. IC-16341 - March 28)

An order has been issued amending a prior order exempting Montgomery Acceptance Corporation III, formerly Oxford Acceptance Corporation III, from all provisions of the Investment Company Act in connection with the issuance and sale of mortgage-backed securities and equity interests. TEMPORARY APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved until July 1 a proposed rule change filed by the MBS Clearing Corporation. The proposal (SR-MBS-87-6) would authorize MBSCC to offer recording, comparison, and margin collection services on option contracts where the underlying contract concerns the purchase or sale of selected government securities, i.e., U.S. Treasury bills, bonds, or notes. USAIR, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 22 to request a hearing on an application by USAir, Inc., a Delaware corporation, under Section 310(b)(1)(ii) of the Trust Indenture Act of 1939.
