U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

NATIONAL CONSUMERS WEEK 1988

"Consumers Buy Service" is the theme for National Consumers Week (NCW) 1988. During the week of April 24-30, the SEC and other federal agencies will emphasize the importance of quality service to consumers. Included in the plans for observing National Consumers Week are updates of selected "Information for Investors" columns and an exhibit on the lower level (1C) of Commission headquarters. Coordinators for this years NCW are Ellen Legel and Teresa Tarver, Office of Consumers Affairs and Information Services, 272-7440.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

REGISTRATION OF INVESTORS PORTFOLIO MANAGEMENT, INC. REVOKED

Chief Administrative Law Judge Warren E. Blair issued an initial decision revoking the investment adviser registration of Investors Portfolio Management, Inc. (IPM), of New York, New York.

Judge Blair found that IPM wilfully violated antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933, the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and the Investment Advisers of 1940 by fraudulent activities involving the sales of shares of a municipal bond fund while acting as the fund's investment adviser and manager. IPM was also found to have wilfully aided and abetted the bond fund's wilful violations of various regulatory provisions of the Investment Company Act of 1940.

IPM was found to have falsely represented that bond fund dividends were tax exempt from Califiornia income taxes and to have failed to disclose material facts regarding the reasons for the significantly higher yields on shares of the bond fund as compared to yields of competing bond funds. IPM was also found to have been instrumental in causing the bond fund's shares to be sold at prices other than current net asset value, causing the bond fund to make distribution payments without valid 12b-1 plan in effect, and aiding and abetting the bond fund's failure to comply with the book-keeping provisions of the Investment Company Act.

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST RICHARD E. MOYER, OTHERS

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under Sections 15(b)(4) and 15(b)(6) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Richard E. Moyer, a registered broker-dealer with Swartwood, Hesse, Inc. (Registrant), T. Marshall Swartwood (Swartwood), one of Registrant's principals and its president, and Registrant.

The Order alleges that Moyer engaged in a fraudulent course of business to manipulate the market for Software Services of America (SSOA) common stock in violation of Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 by, among other things, engaging in wash sales and matched orders, creating actual or apparent trading, directing increases in Registrant's bid price even though it had the leading bid price, and failing to disclose domination and control. It also alleges that, before Registrant had completed its participation in the distribution of units in the initial public offering of SSOA, Moyer caused Registrant to begin bidding in the NASDAQ market for, and purchasing for accounts of its customers, the common stock of SSOA in violation of Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-6. It further alleges that Registrant and Swartwood failed reasonably to supervise Moyer with a view to preventing violations of Section 10(b).

A hearing will be scheduled to determine what, if any, remedial sanctions should be imposed. (Rel. 34-25543)

TRADING SUSPENSIONS

NAME CHANGE IN TRADING SUSPENSION

On April 5, the Commission issued an Order suspending trading for a single ten-day period in 46 issuers under Section 12(k) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. It has since been determined that one of the companies listed in the Order, ASTI, INC. had changed its name to REPUBLIC FINANCIAL GROUP, LTD. The Commission announces that it is modifying the order to reflect this name change. (Rel. 34-25553)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CIVIL INJUNCTIVE ACTION FILED AND SETTLED AGAINST MAXAXAM CORPORATION AND GEORGE E. BRACKETT

The Commission filed suit in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Maxaxam Corporation and its chairman, George E. Brackett, charging them with violations of the antifraud provisions and Maxaxam with aiding and abetting the failure by Twind Energy Corporation, Maxaxam's subsidiary, to file certain forms with the Commission. Without admitting or denying the allegations in the Complaint, the defendants consented to Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction against them.

The Complaint charged that on April 30, 1984, defendants caused the filing of a registration statement for a Twind initial public offering. It also charged that the registration statement was materially false and misleading in that it failed to disclose that all or substantially all of the proceeds of the offering were to be diverted to Maxaxam. Further, it charged Maxaxam with aiding and abetting Twind's failure to file with the Commission Forms S-R disclosing the use of these proceeds. (SEC v. Maxaxam Corporation and George E. Brackett, USDC DC, Civil Action No. 88-0937). (LR-11695)

FINAL JUDGMENT OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST HORIZONS RESEARCH LABORATORIES, INC. AND ANANT K. NIGAM

The Atlanta Regional and Miami Branch Offices announced that on March 14 U.S. District Judge William J. Zloch, Southern District of Florida, issued a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction, Order Requiring An Accounting and Other Relief against Horizons Research Laboratories, Inc. and Anant K. Nigam, of Fort Lauderdale, Florida. The Final Judgment permanently enjoins the defendants from violating the antifraud and registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud and broker registration provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Final Judgment provides that the defendants shall file an accounting of all funds received pursuant to a scheme described in the Commission's Complaint and shall disgorge profits in an amount to be subsequently determined.

The February 29 Complaint alleges that Horizions and Nigam operated an unregistered broker-dealer and sold unregistered securities in the form of limited partnership interests, and obtained money from investors by making misrepresentations and omitting to disclose material facts including, among other things, making projections of future income without any reasonable basis for making the projections. On March 9, the defendants consented to the Final Judgment without admitting or denying the Complaint's allegations. (SEC v. Horizons Research Laboratories, Inc. and Anant K. Nigam, Civil Action No. 88-6144-CIV-ZLOCH). (LR-11691)

COMPLAINT NAMES TWO IN SCHEME TO DEFRAUD

The Seattle Regional Office filed on March 18 a Complaint for Permanent Injunction in the U.S. District Court for the District of Oregon against Robert Poirier and Paul David LaMarre alleging violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Sections 7(f) and 10(b) of the the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, Rule 10b-5 and Regulation X promulgated by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System.

The Complaint alleges a scheme to defraud and omissions to disclose Poirier's control of LaMarre's trading in Premium Equity stock and their intention not to and/or lack of financial capacity to pay for approximately \$800,000 in trades. Without admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint, LaMarre consented to a decree of permanent injunction against him which was entered on March 23. (SEC v. Robert Poirier and Paul David LaMarre, Civil Action No. C88-299, DOR). (LR-11692)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

UNITED SERVICES LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 27 to request a hearing on an application filed by United Services Life Insurance Company (USL), United Services Variable Life Separate Accounts I, II, III, and IV, Bankers Security Life Insurance Society (BSL), Bankers Security Variable Life Separate Accounts I, II, III, and IV, and USLICO Series Fund (collectively, Applicants), for an order exempting them from the provisions of Sections 9(a), 13(a), 15(a), and 15(b) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 6e-2(b)(15) to the extent necessary to permit Applicants to offer their shares to affiliated insurance companies in connection with variable life insurance and variable annuity contracts; for exemptions from Sections 17(a) and 17(d) of the Act and Rule 17d-1 to permit the combination of USL Separate Accounts I, II, III, and IV into USL Separate Account I, and the combination of BSL Separate Accounts I, II, III, and IV into BSL Separate Account I, and the simultaneous issuance of shares of Portfolios of the Fund in exchange for the portfolio assets and related liabilities of the USL and BSL Separate Accounts. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MIDDLE SOUTH UTILITIES, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing Middle South Utilities, Inc., a registered holding company, to amend its charter to increase its authorized number of common stock, to amend its By-Laws relating to the indemnification of certain Middle South representatives and other procedural matters, and to solicit proxies. DOMINION RESOURCES, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing Dominion Resources, Inc., an exempt holding company, to acquire all of the common stock of Suffolk Gas Corporation, a natural gas distribution company, operating in Suffolk, Virginia. (Rel. 35-24616 - April 5)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

CHEMICAL NEW YORK CORPORATION

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application by Chemical New York Corporation that the trusteeship of Citibank, N.A. under two Chemical indentures is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary in the public interest or for the protection of investors to disqualify the Bank from acting as trustee under either indenture.
