EXTENSION OF LOCKBOX RULE

Effective September 1, the Commission is extending the effectiveness of temporary Rule 202.3a to September 1, 1990. This rule permits filing and other fees to be remitted to a U.S. Treasury designated lockbox depository located in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. (Rel. 33-6795)

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY AGENDA AND RULES SCHEDULED FOR REVIEW

The Commission published under the Regulatory Flexibility Act an agenda of open and anticipated rulemaking actions, a listing of rules scheduled for review in the next 12 months, and rule reviews completed since the publication of the April 1988 agenda. The agenda, including the text of the individual entries, will be published in the Federal Register by October 30 as part of a government-wide Unified Agenda of Federal Regulations.

The Commission seeks comments on the open or anticipated rulemaking actions. Comments should be submitted in triplicate to Jonathan A. FOIA APPEAL OF DAVID W. SUSSMAN AFFIRMED

The General Counsel sent a letter to David W. Sussman, Esq., affirming in part the Freedom of Information Act Officer's determination to withhold documents in the Commission's investigative file underlying the Commission's action in SEC v. Armand Leone, Sr. and Rita F. Leone, 88 Civ. 2818 (RJD) (SDNY, April 21, 1988), relating to the purchase or sale of securities of First Jersey National Corp. The General Counsel affirmed the FOIA Officer's determination that the bulk of the documents were exempt from disclosure under FOIA Exemption 7(A), 5 USC 552(b)(7)(A) and 17 CFR 200.80(b)(A). He reversed that determination, however, as to certain public documents in the file, which he decided to release, and he reversed and remanded as to certain documents that were submitted with a confidential treatment request, with instructions that the FOIA Officer determine whether any other exemptions are applicable. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

ORDER ISSUED AGAINST THE GABELLI GROUP, INC., OTHERS

The Commission issued an Order Instituting Proceedings under Section 15(c)(4) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Section 9(b)(2) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and Findings, Opinion and Order of the Commission (Order) against The Gabelli Group, Inc., Gabelli-Rosenthal & Partners, L.P., G & R Partners, Gabelli Funds, Inc., GAMCO Investors, Inc., and Mario J. Gabelli. The Commission found that Respondents failed to comply, and that Mario Gabelli caused the other Respondents' failure to comply, with Section 13(d) of the Exchange Act and Rule 13d-1 in connection with an attempt to pursue a leveraged buyout of DiGiorgio Corporation. The Commission further found that Respondents, other than Mario Gabelli, willfully violated Section 17(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 17d-1.

Each Respondent consented to the Order without admitting or denying any of the matters set forth in the Opinion and Findings therein. (Rel. 34-26005)

CORPORATE REORGANIZATION RELEASES

MELRIDGE, INC.

The Commission announced that on July 28 in the Chapter 11 reorganization case regarding Melridge, Inc., the bankruptcy court awarded interim compensation to counsel for the official equity security holders' committee. Certain parties had objected to the payment of any interim compensation on the grounds that the debtor was insolvent. The Commission had argued that counsel for the equity committee was not precluded from receiving compensation solely because the debtor is, or may be, insolvent. The bankruptcy court, in granting the fee request, did not reach the issue of whether the debtor's insolvency is relevant to an award of compensation to counsel for an official equity committee. (In re Melridge, Inc., Case No. 387-06589-P11, Bankr., D. Ore.). (CR-378)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MASTER RESERVES INCOME FUND;
CORPORATE CASH MANAGEMENT PLUS FUND INC.

Orders have been issued declaring that Master Reserves Income Fund and Corporate Cash Management Plus Fund Inc. have ceased to be investment companies. (Rel. IC-16532 - Aug. 22; IC-16533 - Aug. 23)

COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC.;
EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES

Notices have been issued giving interested persons until September 12 to request a hearing on a proposal by the following companies filed under Release 35-24699, dated August 18: COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC. - a registered holding company, and its subsidiary, Columbia Gas Transmission Corporation, regarding the subsidiary's intrasystem financing arrangements; and EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES (EUA) - a registered holding company, and its subsidiary, EUA Cogenex Corporation, for EUA to guaranty (1) the obligations of EUA Cogenex with respect to short-term borrowings effected by EUA Cogenex under EUA's existing credit lines; and (2) obligations of EUA Cogenex incurred in connection with financing and refinancing the machinery and equipment which EUA Cogenex uses to provide energy services to customers.

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Pacific Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change which became immediately effective upon filing under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposal (SR-PSE-88-11) will amend the Stock Execution Fee and the Independent Broker Fee adopted by the PSE in a prior filing. (Rel. 34-26004)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the Philadelphia Stock Exchange (SR-Phlx-88-26) to increase the unit of trading of British pound foreign currency options contracts listed and eligible for trading on the Phlx from 12,500 pounds to 31,500 pounds. (Rel. 34-26006)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

VIRGINIA ELECTRIC AND POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 16 to request a hearing on an application by Virginia Electric and Power Company, a Virginia corporation, under Section 310(b)(1)(ii) of the Trust Indenture Act of 1939. The application declares that the trusteeship of Chemical Bank under a Company indenture qualified under the Act and under six indentures not qualified under the Act relating to the issuance of certain bonds of certain political subdivisions of the Commonwealth of Virginia and the State of West Virginia, the payment of which is supported by Promissory Notes issued by the Company and assigned to the Bank as trustee, is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary in the public interest or for the protection of investors to disqualify the Bank from acting as trustee under these qualified indentures. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
