COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANCE COMMISSION

CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSED RULE 144A

The Commission yesterday announced that it is postponing consideration of proposed Rule 144A which would provide a safe harbor from the registration requirements of the Securities Act of 1933 for resale of securities to institutional investors. In making the announcement, Chairman David S. Ruder stated that postponement was necessary in order to permit staff review of several important issues raised by Commission members. He stated that he favors the concept of a special exemption for institutional investors embodied in the recommendation of the Division of Corporation Finance, but that additional time is needed so that all aspects of the proposed rule can be thoroughly examined before it is published. The Commission will still meet on Friday, October 14 at 9:00 a.m. to consider proposed Rule 6c-10 under the Investment Company Act.

SEC CHAIRMAN TO ADDRESS ECONOMIC CLUB OF CHICAGO

David S. Ruder, Chairman of the Securities and Exchange Commission, will address the Economic Club of Chicago on Thursday, October 20 in Chicago, Illinois. Subject of the Chairman's remarks will be regulatory and market responses to the October 1987 market break.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES JOSEPH R. EDINGTON, OTHERS

The Commission filed a Complaint for Permanent Injunctions and Disgorgement on September 28 against Joseph R. Edington, a Spokane, Washington securities promoter. Also named in the Complaint are Edington's business associates, Howard Wilkins, Frankie Knight, Michael Pallardy, and Robert Gilchrist, and two corporations organized by Edington, International Medical Marketing, Inc. (IMM), and Image Productions, Inc. Edington, Wilkins, IMM, and Image are charged with violations of the antifraud provi-sions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Knight, Pallardy, and Gilchrist are charged with aiding and abetting those violations. Edington, Wilkins, and IMM are also charged with violations of the securities registration provisions of the Securities Act, and Edington is charged with violations of the broker-dealer registration provisions of the Exchange Act.

The defendants were involved in six different securities offerings between June 1984 and October 1985. Offering proceeds were diverted from the issuers to the personal benefit of Edington and Wilkins in a scheme that was not disclosed to purchasers of securities and that was concealed from investors and the Commission. Each offering also was accompanied by numerous false and misleading statements concerning the business, financial condition, and management of the issuer. (SEC v. Joseph R. Edington, et al., Civil Action No. C88-511-RJM, EDWA). (LR-11890)

COMPLAINT NAMES STAR-COM I, OTHERS

The Atlanta Regional Office filed a Complaint on September 29 in the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Tennessee against Star-Com I Limited, purportedly an Arizona limited partnership; SCN Ltd., headquartered in Reno, Nevada; Star-Com Network, Ltd., subsidiary of SCN; Transcom I, a Michigan partnership; Jamie, Inc., a corporation organized in Nevada; Maurice W. Furlong of Reno, Nevada; James Troester of Prairie Village, Kansas; Samuel D. Johnson of Riverdale, Georgia; and William R. Schilling of Allendale, Michigan.

The Complaint alleges the defendants sold limited partnership interests in Star-Com I Limited and partnership interests in Transcom I and common stock of SCN in violation of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Satellite communications were to be provided. Schilling and Furlong are also alleged to have violated the broker-dealer registration provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

Alleged misstatements and omissions of material fact included the safety of the investment, the existence of contracts for goods and services, the rate of return on the investment, the use of proceeds, the financial condition of the issuer, the ownership of securities sold, and background information on the management. (SEC v. Star-Com I Limited, et al., USDC MDTN, Civil Action No. 3:88-0818-Higgins/Sandidge). (LR-11891)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

ANTHONY J. BUTTIMER SENTENCED

The U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of Georgia and the Atlanta Regional Office announced that on September 28 Chief Judge William C. O'Kelly sentenced Anthony J. Buttimer of Marietta, Georgia to five years in prison, five years probation, and \$800,000 restitution, with probation contingent upon restitution. Buttimer had previously pled guilty on August 18 to one count of fraud under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 an one count of wire fraud.

On August 10 Buttimer, formerly a registered representative, was enjoined from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in an action brought by the Commission [SEC v. Anthony J. Buttimer, USDC NDGA, Civil Action No. 88-CV-1675-MHS, LR-11846]. Buttimer, without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's Complaint, consented to the permanent injunction. In addition, as a result of a related aministrative proceeding, Buttimer was barred from associating with any broker-dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment company, or investment adviser [Rel. 34-26023]. (U.S. v. Anthony J. Buttimer, CR-88-299A, USDC NDGA). (LR-11889)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

UBZ CORPORATION; PREMIER VARIABLE ANNUITY ACCOUNT

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 4 and 7, respectively, to request a hearing on an application filed by UBZ Corporation; and Premier Variable Annuity Account for an order declaring that they have ceased to be investment companies. CENTRAL POWER AND LIGHT COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Central Power and Light Company, Public Service Company of Oklahoma, Southwestern Electric Power Company, and West Texas Utilities Company, subsidiaries of Central and South West Corporation, to acquire, through December 31, 1990, limited amounts of their preferred stock and first mortgage bonds in open market and negotiated transactions at prices not exceeding the then current general redemption prices for such securities. The Midwest Securities Trust Company filed a proposed rule change which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposal (SR-MSTC-88-5) would revise service charges to MSTC participants. (Rel. 34-26168)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by The Options Clearing Corporation (SR-OCC-87-20) authorizing it to invest excess funds in a wholly-owned subsidiary, International Clearing Systems, Inc., to develop data processing and communications services for foreign currency exchange transactions and related collateral and settlement obligations.
