DARREL L. NIELSEN SUSPENDED FROM PRACTICE BEFORE THE COMMISSION

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

The Commission has announced the permanent suspension of Darrel L. Nielsen, an accountant, from appearing or practicing before it, pursuant to Rule 2(e)(3) of the Commission's Rules of Practice. On September 5, 1979, the Commission entered an order of temporary suspension against Mr. Nielsen from appearing or practicing before it. No petition to lift the suspension was filed by Mr. Nielsen, and the suspension became permanent in accordance with the Commission's order of September 5, 1979, and Rule 2(e)(3)(ii) of the Commission Rules of Practice.

The Rule 2(e) proceeding was based on a permanent injunction entered against Mr. Nielsen in SEC v. Richard L. Chatham, et al. On June 7, 1979, the U.S. District Court for the District of Utah, following a trial on the merits, found that Mr. Nielsen had aided and abetted violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. Specifically, the court found that Mr. Nielsen had knowingly furthered, aided and abetted a conspiracy to defraud public investors by certifying financial statements that he knew were fraudulent. The court permanently enjoined Mr. Nielsen from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. Mr. Nielsen took no appeal from the court's order.

Commissioner Karmel dissented for the reasons set forth in her opinion accompanying the Order of Temporary Suspension. (Rel. 34-16479)

YASIN JAFFER CITED

The Commission announced the institution of public administrative proceedings pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Yasin Jaffer (Jaffer), a registered broker-dealer located in Chicago, Illinois. The Order alleges that Jaffer willfully violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in that he made misrepresentations and omitted to state material facts to customers, converted customer funds, and forged checks; that he willfully violated the recordkeeping and reporting requirements of the Exchange Act; and that he failed to send confirmations of securities transactions to customers. A hearing will be scheduled to take evidence on the staff's allegations and to afford Jaffer an opportunity to offer any defenses, and for the purpose of determining whether any remedial action should be offered by the Commission. TRIBUTE TO JUSTICE DOUGLAS

On behalf of the staff and Members of the Commission, Chairman Harold M. Williams today expressed deep sorrow upon the death of William O. Douglas.

Justice Douglas joined the staff of the Commission in 1934, the year the agency was established, was appointed a Commissioner in 1936 and in September 1937, became the Commission's third Chairman. He served as Chairman until April 1939, when he was appointed to the Supreme Court.

"It has been a source of great pride and inspiration to those of us privileged to follow in Justice Douglas' footsteps at the SEC that this great leader was one of the molders of the traditions which we have inherited," Chairman Williams said. "The Commission benefited from Justice Douglas' wisdom and strength during its crucial, formative years, and the standards he set then remain as the standards to which we aspire today.

"I know that my fellow Commissioners and the members of the Commission's staff share in my deep sorrow and great sense of loss, and join me in expressing our heartfelt condolences to Justice Douglas' family."

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

LA POINTE INDUSTRIES, INC. ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on January 18 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia enjoined La Pointe Industries, Inc. of Rockville, Connecticut, from failing timely to file periodic reports with the Commission and ordered it to comply with certain undertakings. The Commission's complaint, filed on October 25, 1979, alleged that La Pointe failed timely to file certain annual and quarterly reports as part of a continuing course of conduct extending over several years. La Pointe, in consenting to the entry of judgment against it, admitted failure to file reports on a timely basis on 7 separate occasions. (SEC v. La Pointe Industries, Inc., U.S.D.C. D.C., Civil Action No. 79-2879). (LR-8977)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

CHARLES D. STILWELL, STEPHEN C. COKER CONVICTED

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on January 10, Charles D. Stilwell and Stephen C. Coker, both of Charleston, South Carolina, each pled guilty to two counts of securities fraud of a criminal information before the Honorable Sol Blatt, Jr., U.S. District Judge, District Court of South Carolina. The information was filed by Thomas E. Lydon, Jr., the U.S. Attorney for the District of South Carolina, on the same date. The criminal charges arose in connection with the defendants' activities while officers and directors of Stilwell, Coker & Co., Inc., a now defunct broker-dealer whose registration was revoked by the Commission on July 19, 1978. No date has been set for the sentencing of the defendants. (U.S. v. Charles D. Stilwell, et al., Criminal Action No. 80-1, D.S.C.). (LR-8974)

BERNARD MAGDOVITZ SENTENCED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on January 7, the Honorable John Powers Crowley sentenced Bernard Magdovitz to five years probation and fined him \$11,000. The sanction was imposed following Magdovitz's plea of guilty to conspiracy and mail fraud charges arising from his involvement in a \$25 million inventory and profit inflation scheme while employed at Cenco Incorporated, a Chicago based corporation. Magdovitz had served as Treasurer of Cenco and President of Cenco Medical Health, a Cenco subsidiary. The earlier civil injunctive action filed by the Commission against Magdovitz and other former Cenco employees is still pending. (U.S. v. Ralph Read, et al., N.D. Ill., 79 CR 277). (LR-8975)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

VANCE, SANDERS MUNICIPAL BOND FUND, LTD.

An order has been issued, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act, on an application of Vance, Sanders Municipal Bond Fund, Ltd. (Bond Fund), registered under the Act as a diversified, open-end, management investment company, Eaton & Howard, Vance Sanders Inc. (EHVS), currently Bond Fund's investment adviser and principal underwriter, and Eaton & Howard, Vance Sanders Distributors Inc. (Distributors), a newly formed subsidiary of EHVS which will assume all of EHVS's activities as principal underwriter for Bond Fund, amending a prior order of the Commission so that William M. Griffin shall not be deemed to be an "interested persons" of Bond Fund, EHVS or Distributors within the meaning of Section 2(a)(19) of the Act by reason of his association with Hartford Fire Insurance Company and certain of its subsidiaries. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MIDDLE SOUTH UTILITIES, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until February 11 to request a hearing on a proposal by Middle South Utilities, Inc. and its wholly-owned subsidiary, Middle South Energy, Inc., whereby the subsidiary will issue and sell to the parent up to 50,000 shares of its common stock from time to time through December 31, 1980 at a price of \$1,000 per share. The proceeds of the sale will be used by the subsidiary to finance construction at the Grand Gulf electric generating facility. (Rel. 35-21400 - Jan. 18)

KINGSPORT POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued approving the issuance and sale by Kingsport Power Company, a subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., of unsecured notes maturing December 31, 1987, to banks in an amount not to exceed \$15 million. (Rel. 35-21401 - Jan. 21)

NSCC has amended and automated its procedures for borrowing securities to satisfy NSCC system needs.
