## NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

### MAXA CORPORATION ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on June 12 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia enjoined Maxa Corporation of New York, New York, from failing to timely file periodic reports with the Commission and ordered it to comply with certain undertakings. The Commission's complaint, filed on March 31, 1980, alleges that Maxa failed to timely file certain Annual Reports on Form 10-K and Quarterly Reports on Form 10-Q as part of a continuing course of conduct extending over several years. Maxa failed to file reports on a timely basis on 13 separate occasions. (SEC v. Maxa Corporation, U.S.D.C. D.C., Civil Action No. 80-804). (LR-9109)
