RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO RULES 242 AND 252

The Commission is proposing for public comment amendments to Rule 242 and to Rule 252 of Regulation A. Rule 242 and Regulation A provide limited offering exemptions from registration under Section 3(b) of the Securities Act of 1933. If a disqualification exists under Rule 242 or Rule 252, no Rule 242 or Regulation A exemption will be available, unless the Commission grants relief from the disqualification upon application by an aggrieved person. The proposed amendments would make disqualifications which now last indefinitely terminate automatically after a specified period of time. They also would modify the list of disqualifications and the persons to whom the disqualifications apply.

All comments should be submitted in triplicate to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 500 North Capitol St., Washington, D.C. 20549 on or before August 30, 1980, and should refer to File No. S7-840. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES ROBINEX INTERNATIONAL, LTD.

The Commission announced that on June 20, it filed in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia a civil injunctive action against Robinex International, Ltd. The Commission's complaint alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeks Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Order Relief. The complaint alleges that Robinex, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct, has failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended January 31, 1980, required to have been filed with the Commission by April 30, 1980. The complaint requests that the Court order Robinex to file forthwith, with the Commission, its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended January 31, 1980. Further, the Commission requested that the Court enjoin Robinex from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

EQUITABLE MONEY MARKET ACCOUNT, INC.

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CORAL PETROLEUM, INC.

The Commission had declined to take jurisdiction over an application filed by Coral Petroleum to acquire about 8-1/2% of the common stock of Pacific Resources, Inc., an exempt holding company. The Commission noted that Section 9(a)(2), which requires Commission approval under Section 10 for certain stock acquisitions, does not apply to an acquisition of the stock of an exempt holding company which is not itself a public utility and which has only one public utility subsidiary. The Commission expressly overruled an earlier decision in which it had interpreted Section 9(a)(2) to the company. (Rel. 35-21632 - June 19)

UNLISTED TRADING GRANTED

The Commission has approved an amended proposed rule change filed by the <u>National Association of</u> <u>Securities Dealers</u>, Inc. (SR-NASD-78-8) permitting NASD members who are not NASDAQ Level III subscribers to gain access to the NASDAQ system for market making purposes. (Rel. 34-16913)
