SEC WEBSITE TRANSMITS BILLIONTH PAGE OF DATA TO U.S. INVESTORS, PRESS, AND PUBLIC; SITE INFORMS INVESTORS, PROMOTES EFFICIENT MARKETS, AND ENHANCES SEC OVERSIGHT

On April 16, the Commission's website <www.sec.gov> transmitted its billionth page of text and data. Since going on line in September 1995, the website has received more than 95 million hits and dispensed more than 1 billion pages of information. (Press Rel. 97-35)

BULLETIN FROM THE U.S. TREASURY DEPARTMENT'S OFFICE OF FOREIGN ASSETS CONTROL (OFAC)

On October 21, 1995, President Clinton signed Executive order 12978 which blocks all property subject to U.S. jurisdiction in which there is any interest of individuals and businesses determined to be involved in international narcotics trafficking centered in Colombia. A series of names was published at that time, and two additional listings were published on March 5, 1996 and January 15, 1997. On April 17, 1997, OFAC designated a number of additional businesses and individuals as "Specially Designated Narcotics Traffickers". Those names have been added to OFAC'S master list of "Specially Designated Nationals and Blocked Persons" (SDN's). The names which have been filed with the <u>Federal Register</u>, are now available on OFAC'S World Wide Web home page (HTTP://WWW.

You are reminded that the sanctions and embargo programs administered by OFAC usually involve declarations of national emergency by the President of the United States and require the immediate attention of broker/dealers. Securities firms must freeze accounts and assets of persons and companies identified on OFAC's SDN list or otherwise blocked under sanctions against Cuba, North Korea, Libya and Iraq. 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ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

COMMISSION OBTAINS PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION AGAINST TIMOTHY HILLS AND S.J. WINDSOR CAPITAL PARTNERS LLP

The Commission announced that on April 9 Timothy A. Hills (Hills) and S.J. Windsor Capital Partners LLP (S.J. Windsor) consented to preliminary injunctions. As a result, Hills is preliminarily enjoined from further violating the <u>Order Making Findings and</u> <u>Imposing Remedial Sanctions and Cease and Desist Order</u>, which was issued on consent by the Commission on November 8, 1995 (Commission Order) in a prior administrative proceeding instituted against Hills, <u>In the Matter of Timothy A. Hills</u>, A.P. File No. 3-8707 (June 1, 1995). S.J. Windsor is preliminarily enjoined from further violating the broker registration provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act). The defendants have also been ordered not to destroy or alter documents.

On April 2, 1997, the Commission had filed a complaint in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of New York against Hills and S.J. Windsor alleging that, since at least August 1996, S.J. Windsor has been operating as an unregistered broker in violation of the broker registration provisions of the Exchange Act and that Hills, a former Stratton Oakmont, Inc. broker, has been violating the Commission Order by associating with S.J. Windsor and soliciting investors to purchase securities of Cyberweb Cafe, Inc., as well as the securities of other companies. The Commission Order, which Hills is alleged to have violated, barred Hills from association with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser and municipal securities dealer. The complaint also seeks permanent injunctions and civil penalties against the defendants.

Also at the time the complaint was filed, the Commission made an application for a temporary restraining order, which was granted as to Hills on April 3, 1997. A hearing before the Honorable Thomas C. Platt on the application for preliminary injunctions took place on April 8, 1997 and April 9, 1997 and, prior to the conclusion of the hearing, the defendants consented to the preliminary injunctions. COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST NEIL LIECHTY

On February 27, a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Alabama against Neil A. Liechty (Liechty) and Neil Liechty, Inc. (NLI), alleging violations of Sections 17(a)(1) through 17(a)(3) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder.

The complaint alleges that Liechty and NLI misrepresented material facts in the offer and sale of limited partnership interests formed to develop apartment complexes in Alabama and Florida. Among other misrepresentations, Liechty and NLI claimed that the issuers would be debt-free, that certain facilities would be built with the proceeds of the offerings and that only a specified dollar amount of the securities would be sold. They omitted to disclose that funds from the various entities were being commingled.

Simultaneously with the filing of the complaint, without admitting or denying the allegations made against them, Liechty and NLI consented to the entry of a judgment of permanent injunction and The judgment provides that Liechty and NLI will other relief. provide an accounting of all monies received in connection with the and that disgorgement and civil penalties will be offerings, determined at a later date. CONTEMPT ORDER ENTERED AGAINST FORREST SYGMAN DESPITE FLORIDA HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION

On April 4, the Honorable Jose A. Gonzalez, U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of Florida, entered an order of contempt against Forrest Sygman (Sygman), former attorney for defendant Danny Sterk (Sterk), for failure to pay \$136,910 of a total compensatory fine of \$175,000 imposed on Sygman, Sterk and Sterk's wife, Fanny, by the Court on December 14, 1995. The contempt order was entered after the Court held hearings to determine the current financial situation of Sygman who claimed a financial inability to pay the fine.

The Court previously entered an order finding Sygman and the Sterks in civil contempt for violating the Court's orders freezing assets owned or controlled by Sterk. The Court imposed a total compensatory fine of \$175,000 on Sygman and the Sterks, with Sygman jointly and severally liable for \$136,910 of the fine. The fine represented the funds which each individual transferred in violation of the freeze orders. The contempt order provided that the contempt could be purged by payment of the fine. However, the fine was not paid.

As a result of the February 1997 hearing, the Court determined that Sygman had the financial means to pay the fine and found that Sygman was in contempt of the Court's order of December 14, 1995. Although Sygman asserted the Florida "homestead exemption" with regard to his residence, the Court ruled that the state homestead exemption does not prevent a federal court from considering the value of a residence in assessing a contemnor's ability to purge. The Court ordered Sygman to effect the transfer of the title of his residence to the Receiver or, in the alternative, to pay to the Receiver \$25,000 of the monies owed within 60 days of the date of the Order. If Sygman fails to either transfer the title to his residence or make the \$25,000 payment to the Receiver, he is subject to arrest Antipation of the state of the second states and and incarceration upon the Receiver's notification to the Court.

PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION ISSUED AGAINST GLOBAL FINANCIAL TRADERS, LTD., BGSG HOLDING CORP., MICHAEL REILLY, AND JOHN KENNA

The Commission announced that on April 11 a preliminary injunction and continuation of an asset freeze had been ordered against Global Financial Traders, Ltd. (Global), BGSG Holding Corp. (BGSG), Michael R. Reilly (Reilly), and John J. Kenna (Kenna). The defendants were enjoined from further violations of Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, and Rules 101 and 102 of Regulation M thereunder. Two other defendants, Vincent J. Iovine (Iovine) and David S. Coleman (Coleman), consented to continuation of a TRO issued on March 13.

The Commission's complaint alleged that Reilly and Kenna were engaged in sales of large blocks of stock using a telemarketing campaign by personnel at Global, which Reilly and Kenna control, and recommendations in a newsletter published by Global, making misrepresentations concerning the market for the stock, and failing to disclose Reilly and Kenna's interest in the security and their stock sales. It was alleged that Reilly, Kenna, Iovine, and Coleman had maintained the market price within a desired trading range by bidding for and purchasing the stock, and that Global, BGSG, Reilly, and Kenna had realized over \$5.8 million in net profits from their stock sales. UNITED STATES v. PHILIP RENNERT, DAVID YEAMAN, MICHAEL MILLER, GEORGE JENSEN, AND NOLAN MENDENHALL

On April 16, the jury returned verdicts charging conspiracy to commit wire fraud and securities fraud, as well as substantive The scheme involved the creation of public securities fraud. companies by reverse merger from public shells whose stock had initially been "gifted" to churches and other institutions, and which had sat on the shelf for over three years; the subsequent manipulation of the markets for those stocks; the leasing of the stocks to off-shore reinsurance companies to be used as assets to inflate their balance sheets; and the deposit of some of those stocks with Philadelphia banks that acted as escrow agents for reinsurance treaties with Pennsylvania insurance companies. The jury found Philip Rennert, David Rex Yeaman, and Michael Miller, a lawyer, guilty on 11 of the 13 counts with which they were charged. The two remaining defendants, George Jensen and Nolan Mendenhall were found guilty of substantive securities fraud counts in connection with the pledging of the stocks into the Philadelphia banks. The jury was unable to reach a unanimous verdict for these two defendants on the conspiracy and substantive wire fraud counts. Sentencing is scheduled for July 21, 1997. [U.S. v. SUMMARY JUDGMENT ORDERED AGAINST JEFFREY CARTER

The Commission announced the entry of a summary judgment against Jeffrey Carter on March 25, 1997, and an amended order against Carter on April 1, 1997. The Commission's complaint, which was filed on May 3, 1995, alleged that Carter, in conjunction with other defendants, procured investors for Kenton Capital, Ltd.'s fraudulent "bank instrument" trading programs.

The summary judgment permanently enjoins Carter from future violations of Sections 5(a), 5(c) and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Sections 10(b) and 15(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, and Section 203(a) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940, and orders him to disgorge, jointly and severally with all other defendants, \$264,245.10, plus prejudgment interest of \$48,914.40, which amount was determined by an April 8, 1997, order of the Court, for a total disgorgement sum of \$313,159.50. The amended order requires Carter to pay a civil penalty of \$1.2 million.

The Court previously issued a temporary restraining order and an asset freeze on May 3, 1995, and a preliminary injunction on June 23, 1995. On July 18, 1996, the Court entered final judgments against Joseph Silvestri, Charles Smith and Atlantic Pacific Guarantee Corporation. On October 17, 1996, the Court entered a final judgment against Harry Watson, Tracy French and Deltaur Partners. On February 25, 1997, the Court entered a final judgment against Terry Plack. The Commission's litigation continues with respect to defendants Kenton Capital, Ltd. and Donald Wallace. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

INSURED TAX-EXEMPT LEASE TRUST SERIES 1

An order has been issued under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that Insured Tax-Exempt Lease Trust Series 1 has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-22621 - April 16)

GOLDMAN, SACHS & CO.

An order has been issued on an application filed by Goldman, Sachs & Co. (Goldman Sachs) under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting the Automatic Common Exchange Security Trusts and certain future trusts for which Goldman Sachs will serve as a

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principal underwriter (Trusts) from Sections 12(d)(1) and 14(a) of the Act, and under Section 17(b) of the Act exempting Goldman Sachs and the Trusts from Section 17(a) of the Act. The order would permit other registered investment companies to own a greater percentage of the total outstanding voting stock (Securities) of each trust than that permitted by Section 12(d)(1); exempt the Trusts from the initial net worth requirements of Section 14(a); and permit the Trusts to purchase U.S. government securities from Goldman Sachs at the time of a Trust's initial issuance of Securities.
