ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

INTERACTIVE MEDICAL TECHNOLOGY, DR. WILLIAM SHELL AND CLARK HOLCOMB CHARGED IN UNREGISTERED OFFERING

On August 13, the Commission filed a complaint alleging that Interactive Medical Technology, Inc. (IMT), Dr. William Shell, the former president of IMT, and Clark Holcomb, a California real estate broker, offered shares of IMT stock without a registration statement being in effect. From approximately April 1992 through June 1993, IMT, Shell and Holcomb raised \$5 million from the sale of approximately 2.5 million shares of IMT stock to over 300 investors. Both IMT and Shell were previously enjoined from violating the registration provisions, based upon IMT's prior offering of unregistered securities (SEC v. Interactive Medical Technologies, 92 Civ. 6409, SDNY, 1992). The complaint also charges Holcomb with acting as an unregistered broker-dealer in connection with the public offering of IMT stock.

Simultaneously, and without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations, IMT and Holcomb consented to the entry of Final Judgments enjoining them from violating the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933. Holcomb also consented to be enjoined from violating the broker-dealer registration provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. No civil penalties were imposed against Holcomb based upon his demonstrated inability to pay.

With respect to Shell, the complaint seeks a permanent injunction against future violations of the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and civil penalties for his violation thereof. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PW MASTERS FUND, L.P.

An order has been issued on an application filed by PW Masters Fund, L.P. under Section 6(b) of the Investment Company Act. The order exempts applicant and certain other partnerships from most provisions of the Act and permits the partnerships to engage in certain affiliated and joint transactions. Each partnership will be an employees' securities company within the meaning of Section 2(a)(13) of the Act. (Rel. IC-22785 - August 12)

HOTCHKIS AND WILEY VARIABLE TRUST

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting Hotchkis and Wiley Variable Trust (Trust) and Merrill Lynch Asset Management, L.P. (MLAM) from the provisions of Sections 9(a), 13(a), 15(a) and 15(b) of the Act, and Rules 6e-2(b)(15) and 6e-3(T)(b)(15) thereunder. The order provides exemptions to the extent necessary to permit shares of the Trust and all similar investment companies for which Hotchkis & Wiley, an operating division of MLAM, may in the future serve as manager, investment adviser, administrator, principal underwriter or sponsor to be sold to and held by separate accounts funding variable annuity and variable life insurance contracts issued by both affiliated and unaffiliated life insurance companies; and qualified pension and retirement plans outside of the separate account context. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

A proposed rule change filed by the <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> to extend the pilot program for equity and index option specialist enhanced parity split participations (SR-PHLX-97-36) has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal</u> Register during the week of August 18. (Rel. 34-38924)

The <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-97-55) relating to computer-to-computer interface circuit fees for NASD members. The proposed rule change has become effective upon filing with the Commission. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of August 18. (Rel. 34-38926)

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-97-54) relating to computer-to-computer interface circuit fees for non-NASD members. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of August 18. (Rel. 34-38925)

The <u>Pacific Exchange</u> filed a proposed amendment to its Rules 6.28, 6.37 and 6.87 (SR-PCX-97-21) to add additional safeguards and procedures for use in unusual market conditions. Specifically, the amendment sets forth additional rules for suspension of Auto-Ex and for widening spread differentials in options issues. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of August 18. (Rel. 34-38927)

Litigation Release No. 15441 / August 13, 1997

SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION v. INTERACTIVE MEDICAL TECHNOLOGIES LTD., WILLIAM E. SHELL, AND CLARK M. HOLCOMB, 97 Civ. 6027 (S.D.N.Y. August 13, 1997)

The Securities and Exchange Commission filed a Complaint today charging Interactive Medical Technology, Inc. ("IMT"), Dr. William E. Shell, the former president of IMT, and Clark M. Holcomb with violating the registration provisions of the federal securities laws in connection with their offering of approximately 2.5 million shares of IMT common stock to the public during 1992 and 1993. Holcomb was also charged with acting as an unregistered broker-dealer in connection with this public offering of IMT stock.

IMT is a corporation with its principal offices in Santa Monica, California. During the relevant time period, IMT was engaged in the development of, among other things, dietary supplements. Shell, age 53, is a founder of IMT and a medical doctor with a cardiology practice in Beverly Hills, California. During the relevant time period, Shell served as IMT's president, chief executive officer and chairman of the board. Holcomb, age 47, is a licensed real-estate agent who resides in Westlake Village, California.

The Complaint alleges that from approximately April 1992 through at least June 1993, IMT, Shell and Holcomb raised approximately \$5 million from the sale of IMT stock to approximately 300 investors. No registration statement was in effect with respect to these shares of IMT stock. Both IMT and Shell were previously enjoined from violating the registration provisions, based upon IMT's prior offering of unregistered IMT securities. See SEC v. Interactive Medical Technologies, Ltd., 92 Civ. 6409 (S.D.N.Y. 1992), Lit. Rel. No. 13354. The Complaint also alleges that during the course of selling shares of IMT stock to the public, Holcomb acted as a broker-dealer without registering as one, in violation of the broker-dealer registration provisions.

The Complaint seeks the following relief: (1) permanent injunctions from future violation of Section 5 of the Securities Act of 1933 (i.e., the registration provisions) against IMT, Shell and Holcomb; (2) a permanent injunction from future violation of Section 15(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (i.e., the broker-dealer registration provisions) against Holcomb and (3) civil penalties against Shell and Holcomb.

Simultaneous with the filing of the Complaint, and without admitting or denying the allegations therein, IMT and Holcomb consented to the entry of Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction. No civil penalty was imposed against Holcomb based upon his demonstrated inability to pay.
