COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

CHAIRMAN LEVITT ANNOUNCES APPOINTMENT OF RANDALL FONS TO HEAD ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM IN MIDWEST REGIONAL OFFICE

Chairman Levitt today announced the appointment of Randall J. Fons as Associate Regional Director (Enforcement) in the Commission's Midwest Regional Office. The Regional Office, located in Chicago, has jurisdiction over both enforcement and regulatory programs in a ninestate area. As Associate Regional Director, Mr. Fons will oversee and coordinate the overall enforcement program within the Midwest Region. (Press Rel. 95-42)

SEC AND CFTC RECEIVE DERIVATIVES POLICY GROUP REPORT CALLING IT A "POSITIVE STEP IN IMPROVING DERIVATIVES OVERSIGHT"

Chairman Arthur Levitt and Commodity Futures Trading Commission Chairman Mary Schapiro today announced the receipt of the report of the Derivatives Policy Group (DPG). The DPG convened last August to develop a voluntary oversight framework for the over-the-counter (OTC) derivatives activities of broker-dealers' unregistered affiliates. The firms participating in the DPG were the six broker-dealers with the largest OTC derivatives affiliates.

The report sets forth a series of commitments to which its members agree to adhere in the areas of (1) strengthened management control systems; (2) enhanced quantitative reporting to the SEC and the CFTC; (3) a framework for the evaluation of risk in relation to capital; and, (4) guidelines relating to relationships of professional intermediaries with nonprofessional counterparties with respect to OTC derivatives transactions. In accepting the report, Chairmen Levitt and Schapiro said, "Since August, industry representatives have been working actively to take up the challenge. We appreciate the extraordinary efforts of the DPG and know that the time it has committed to these efforts has been time wellspent.

"The report should be viewed as part of an ongoing process by the SEC and CFTC to address the OTC derivative activities of non-bank dealers. With this information, the Commissions have an opportunity to analyze in an improved fashion the firms' OTC derivative activities and their implications for systemic risk." (Press Rel. 95-43)

ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

IN THE MATTER OF VICTOR TEICHER, ET AL.

Judge Glenn Robert Lawrence barred Victor Teicher from association with any broker or dealer, investment company, investment adviser (both registered and unregistered) or municipal securities dealer, and barred Teicher & Co., Inc., from association with any broker or dealer, company, investment adviser (both investment registered and unregistered), or municipal securities dealer. Teicher and Teicher & Co. had stipulated to the sanctions with the exception of a bar from associating with unregistered investment advisers. In barring Teicher and Teicher & Co. from association with unregistered investment advisers, Judge Lawrence concluded that the Commission has authority under Sections 203(e) and (f) of the Advisers Act to bar these respondents from associating with unregistered investment advisers and that it was in the public interest to do so. Teicher and Teicher & Co. had argued that the Advisers Act did not authorize the Commission to sanction an unregistered investment adviser and associated persons.

Judge Lawrence also barred Ross S. Frankel from association with any broker or dealer, investment company, municipal securities dealer, member of a national securities exchange or registered securities association based on Frankel's criminal convictions for securities fraud, mail fraud, perjury and obstruction of justice; a civil injunction enjoining Frankel from future violations of the securities laws and ordering disgorgement; and public interest considerations. Judge Lawrence declined to bar Frankel from association with investment advisers, rejecting the argument that the Commission may impose a bar from any aspect of the securities industry under Section 15(b)(6) of the Exchange Act that allows the Commission to "place limitations on the activities or functions" of persons associated with brokers or dealers. ABT GROWTH AND INCOME TRUST, ET AL.

An order has been issued under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act on an application filed by ABT Growth and Income Trust, ABT Utility Income Fund, Inc., ABT Investment Series, Inc., ABT Southern Master Trust, ABT Financial Services, Inc., and Palm Beach Capital Management, Ltd. granting an exemption from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 18(f), 18(g), 18(i), 22(c) and 22(d) of the Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder to permit the establishment of a multiple class and contingent deferred sales load arrangement. (Rel. IC-20944 - March 7)

SMITH BREEDEN INSTITUTIONAL INTERMEDIATE DURATION U.S. GOVERNMENT FUND

An order has been issued under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that Smith Breeden Institutional Intermediate Duration U.S. Government Fund has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-20945 - March 8)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The <u>Midwest Securities Trust Company</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-MSTC-95-03), which became effective upon filing, to waive the fees applicable to MSTC's Legal Expert System until March 1, 1995. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of March 13. (Rel. 34-35447)

<u>The Depository Trust Company</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-DTC-95-03), which became effective upon filing, to clarify that DTC's procedures for charging back from participants' accounts erroneous or improper payments of dividends, interest, and redemption proceeds and the subsequent return of such funds to the payors do not apply to payments made for instruments in DTC's Money Market Instrument programs. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of March 13. (Rel. 34-35452)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission issued an order supplementing recently adopted rules for short position reporting by the <u>New York Stock Exchange</u>, <u>Philadelphia</u> <u>Stock Exchange</u>, <u>Pacific Stock Exchange</u>, <u>Boston Stock Exchange</u>, <u>Chicago</u> <u>Stock Exchange</u>, <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u>, and <u>Chicago</u> <u>Board Options Exchange</u> (SR-NYSE-94-39; SR-Phlx-94-29; SR-PSE-94-34; SR-BSE-94-15; SR-CHX-94-28; SR-NASD-94-67; SR-CBOE-94-55). PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>American Stock Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-Amex-95-10) relating to amendments updating various Exchange rules. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of March 13. (Rel. 34-35451)

AMENDED PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> filed an amended proposed rule change (SR-NASD-94-62) to amend its Interpretation under Article III, Section 1 of the NASD Rules of Fair Practice relating to limit order protection for member-to-member limit order handling in The Nasdaq Stock Market. The amendments would clarify that the "terms and conditions" exception to the Interpretation applies to limit orders for 10,000 shares or more and \$100,000 in value or more; and limit orders from institutional accounts. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of March 13. (Rel. 34-35454)
