ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

CEASE AND DESIST ORDER IMPOSED AGAINST JOHN HOUSE AND THE OUTER SPACE DEVELOPMENT COMPANY

The Commission has instituted cease and desist proceedings, made findings and imposed a cease and desist order (Order) against John M. House (House) of Wilton Manors, Florida and The Outer Space Development Company (OUSPADEV), a privately-held, development stage Florida corporation based in Fort Lauderdale. House is the majority shareholder, president and a director of OUSPADEV.

The Commission has accepted an Offer of Settlement, in which House consents, without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, to the Order which contains findings by the Commission that House caused OUSPADEV's violations of Section 17(a) (1) of the Securities Act of 1933 (Securities Act), by intentionally preparing and distributing offering documents in OUSPADEV's private offering, including a letter on OUSPADEV stationery soliciting investors, a private placement memorandum and cash flow projections, which contained misrepresentations and omissions of material fact.

The Order requires House and OUSPADEV to cease and desist from committing or causing a violation or future violations of Section 17(a)(1) of the Securities Act. (Rel. 33-7217)

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST RICHARD WIWI AND ORACLE PARTNERS

The Commission announced it instituted public administrative and cease and desist proceedings against Richard G. Wiwi (Wiwi) and Oracle Partners (Oracle) pursuant to Section 8A of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 21C of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Section 9(f) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 (ICA) and also against Wiwi pursuant to Section 15(b)(6) of the Exchange Act and Section 9(b) of the ICA. The Order alleges that Wiwi and Oracle offered and sold unregistered securities of Oracle to the general public, Oracle failed to register as an investment company and Wiwi willfully aided and abetted and caused Oracle's violation. In addition, the Order alleges that Wiwi and Oracle made misrepresentations and omissions to investors regarding, among other things, the length of time Oracle had been in existence and Oracle's investment history.

A hearing will be scheduled to determine if the allegations are true and, if so, whether cease and desist orders, accountings and disgorgement are appropriate against Oracle and Wiwi and whether remedial sanctions and penalties are appropriate against Wiwi. (Rels. 33-7218; 34-36249; IC-21364)

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER AGAINST QUALIFIED PENSIONS, INC. AND JERRY ALLISON

On September 13, the United States District Court for the District of Columbia granted the Commission's application for a temporary restraining order against Qualified Pensions, Inc. (QPI) and Jerry G. Allison (Allison). The Commission filed a complaint on September 13 alleging that QPI and Allison had misappropriated at least \$4.5 million in retirement savings that were entrusted to QPI by its clients to be maintained in Individual Retirement Accounts, and had violated the broker-dealer registration provisions. The temporary restraining order, among other things, freezes all assets of Allison and QPI, and prohibits them from receiving or depositing any additional investor funds. On September 14, the Court issued another order extending the relief previously granted as to Allison and QPI, and freezing all funds or assets received by the relief defendants -- Scott Woodward, S.T. Woodward Design and Construction, Inc. and the Lynx Land and Mining Company -- from Allison or QPI. On September 18, the Court, on the Commission's motion, entered an Order directing the United States Marshal's Service to seize and keep safe pending the final disposition of the Commission's application for a preliminary injunction all records located at QPI's offices in Glendale, California and Scottsdale, Arizona. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

FRANKLIN PENNSYLVANIA INVESTORS FUND

An order has been issued under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that Franklin Pennsylvania Investors Fund has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-21365 - September 19) CONSULTING GROUP CAPITAL MARKETS FUNDS AND SMITH BARNEY MUTUAL FUNDS MANAGEMENT INC.

A conditional order has been issued on an application filed by Consulting Group Capital Markets Funds (Trust) and Smith Barney Mutual Funds Management Inc. under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting applicants from the provisions of Section 15(a) of the Act and Rule 18f-2 thereunder; and from certain disclosure requirements set forth in item 22 of Schedule 14A under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, items 2, 5(b)(iii), and 16(a)(iii) of Form N-1A, item 3 of Form N-14, item 48 of Form N-SAR, and Sections 6-07(2)(a), (b), and (c) of Regulation S-X. The order permits the Trust's investment adviser, The Consulting Group (a division of Smith Barney Mutual Funds Management Inc.), to enter into sub-advisory agreements on behalf of the Trust without receiving approval by the Trust's shareholders, and permits the Trust to disclose only aggregate sub-advisory fees for each series of the Trust in their prospectuses and other reports. GREAT-WEST LIFE & ANNUITY INSURANCE COMPANY, ET AL.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act amending a previous order that granted exemptions from the provisions of Sections 26(a) and 27(c)(2) of the Act to Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company (Company), The Great-West Life Assurance Company, and FutureFunds Series Account (Separate Account) to the extent necessary to permit the deduction of mortality and expense risk charges from the assets of the Separate Account in connection with the issuance and sale of certain group variable annuity contracts (Contracts). The amendment will permit the deduction of mortality and expense risk charges from the assets of any other separate account established in the future by the Company, in connection with the issuance of certain group variable annuity contracts that are substantially similar in all material respects to the Contracts.
