COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

STEPHEN SWAD APPOINTED DEPUTY CHIEF ACCOUNTANT

Chief Accountant Michael H. Sutton announced on September 9 that Stephen M. Swad has been appointed as the Deputy Chief Accountant in the Commission's Office of the Chief Accountant (OCA). In this capacity, Mr. Swad will manage the day-to-day operations of the Office, including overseeing the accounting and auditing aspects of the resolution of registrant issues, enforcement actions, rulemaking projects, and private sector standard setting efforts. FEE RATE ADVISORY

The Congress and the Administration are working on an extension to the current Continuing Resolution on fiscal 1996 funding scheduled to expire on Monday, November 13, 1995. If an extension to the Continuing Resolution is not enacted, the Section 6(b) fee rate will revert to 1/50th of one percent. If an extension is enacted, the Section 6(b) fee rate is expected to continue at the current rate of 1/29th of one percent. (Press Rel. 95-238)

It is possible that formal notice regarding the status of any extension to the current Continuing Resolution may not be available before 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, November 14th, when the Commission's electronic filing and document receipt activity opens for business. Therefore, any filer who wishes to register securities pursuant to Section 6(b) of the Securities Act at or after 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, November 14, should contact the Office of Filer Support at (202) 942-8900 to obtain the proper fee rate in effect. In the event that a registration statement under Section 6(b) is filed at a fee rate of 1/29th of one percent, during a time when the fee rate had reverted to 1/50th of one percent, the filer may choose, by contacting the Office of Filer Support in writing, to have any excess fees applied to a subsequent filing or refunded. The Commission will issue further notices as appropriate to keep registrants informed of developments affecting the Section 6(b) fee rate.

COMMISSION'S CONSUMER AFFAIRS ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

The Commission's Consumer Affairs Advisory Committee will meet on November 15 in Room 1C30 at the Commission's Headquarters beginning at 9:00 a.m. The meeting will be opened to the public. The Committee will consider and review Commission developments on investor initiatives such as descriptions of risk in mutual funds, profile prospectuses, new rules governing municipal securities, proposals to improve trading prices for investors, compensations practices, arbitration and other current issues. ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

SEC BARS STEPHEN GOODWIN - INVESTMENT ADVISER

On November 9, the Commission simultaneously instituted and settled public administrative proceedings against two registered investment advisers, C&G Asset Management, Inc. (C&G) and Cartwright & Goodwin, Inc. (CGI), and their principal, Stephen R. Goodwin (collectively, Respondents). The Commission's Order Instituting Proceedings (Order) found that the Respondents willfully violated the provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 (Advisers Act) that require the maintenance of correspondence files, journals for cash receipts, and trial balances and financial statements. Additionally, the Respondents failed to file certain annual reports on Form ADV-S, as required by the Advisers Act.

The Order revokes C&G's and CGI's registrations as investment advisers and bars Goodwin from associating with any investment adviser, broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer or investment company, provided that he may apply for reinstatement with the Commission after a period of eighteen (18) months. Finally, the Commission ordered the Respondents to cease and desist from committing or causing any violations or future violations of Sections 204, 206(4) and 207 of the Advisers Act and Rules 204-2(a)(1), 204-2(a)(4), 204-2(a)(5), 204-2(a)(6), 204-2(a)(7), 204-2(a)(16), 204-1(b)(1), 204-1(c) and 206(4)-1(a)(5) thereunder. ORDER PERMITTING ASSOCIATION OF PETER GARDINER

On November 9, the Commission issued a Declaratory Order (Order) regarding the association of Peter R. Gardiner as a registered representative with ONYX Partners, Inc., a member of the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (NASD). The Order states that, based on representations made regarding the supervision of Mr. Gardiner and the terms and conditions of his association, the Commission will not institute administrative proceedings pursuant to Sections 15(b) or 19(h) of the Exchange Act and will not direct the NASD to bar the proposed association pursuant to Section 15A(g)(2). The Order granting consent to the association is necessary because Mr. Gardiner is subject to a 1991 order of the Commission barring him from association with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser or municipal securities dealer, with a proviso that he may apply to become so associated after three years. MOTION FOR JUDGMENT OF CIVIL CONTEMPT FILED AGAINST DEFENDANTS OWEN FOX AND BRUCE FRANKLIN FOR FAILURE TO PAY COURT ORDERED DISGORGEMENT AND PREJUDGMENT INTEREST

On November 8, the Commission filed a motion for civil contempt against Defendants Owen R. Fox (Fox) and Bruce Franklin (Franklin) in the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California based upon Fox's and Franklin's failure to pay Court-ordered disgorgement and prejudgment interest awarded as a result of the Commission's civil enforcement action. On September 7, 1995, the Court entered a Judgment Against Defendants Owen R. Fox, Carroll E. Siemens, Bruce Franklin, Michael J. Colello and Douglas S. Cross (Judgment) following granting the Commission's summary judgment motions.

The Judgment orders Fox to pay disgorgement in the total sum of \$7,850,710.09, plus prejudgment interest of \$663,728.42 thereon. The Judgment also orders Franklin to pay disgorgement totalling \$2,392,986.21 and \$204,611.06 in prejudgment interest. Fox and Franklin are jointly and severally liable for their disgorgement and prejudgment interest with various other defendants in the civil action. [SEC v. ORDER OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST MICHAEL MONUS IN CONNECTION WITH ACCOUNTING FRAUD AT PHAR-MOR, INC.

The Commission announced that an Order of Permanent Injunction was entered against Michael Monus (Monus) on November 2 by the Honorable Kathleen O'Malley, District Court Judge for the Northern District of Ohio. The Order also bars Monus from serving as an officer or director of a public company. Additionally, the Order leaves open the issue of determining the appropriate amount, if any, of disgorgement, prejudgment interest and civil penalties to be imposed. Monus is the former President and Chief Operating Officer of Phar-Mor, Inc. Previously, on May 2, 1995, the Commission filed a complaint against Monus, as well as Patrick Finn, Jeffrey Walley

and John Anderson, alleging violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The complaint alleged that from at least 1987 through 1992, Monus, Finn and Anderson, and, beginning in July 1990, Walley, while employed at Phar-Mor, Inc., engaged in a fraudulent scheme in which they falsified Phar-Mor's books, records and financial statements in order to artificially increase corporate profits. As a result of the defendants' fraudulent activities, from fiscal year 1987 through 1991, Phar-Mor cumulatively overstated income by \$290 million. In fiscal year 1992, the year in which the fraud was detected, Phar-Mor overstated income by approximately \$238 million. [SEC v. Michael Monus, et al., N.D. OH., Case No. 4:95 CV 975] (LR-14716)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC., ET AL.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Columbia Gas System, Inc. (Columbia), a registered holding company, seventeen wholly-owned subsidiary companies of Columbia, including TriStar Ventures Corp. (TriStar), twelve subsidiary companies of TriStar, Columbia Gas Transmission Corp. (Gas Transmission), and Columbia Energy Marketing Corp. (Energy Marketing), for Gas Transmission and Energy Marketing to invest in, but not to borrow from, an Intrasystem Money Pool through 1996. (Rel. 35-26404)

DELISTING GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the application of the <u>Boston Stock Exchange</u> to strike from listing and registration Angeion Corporation, Common Stock, \$.01 Par Value and its Warrants to purchase one-half share of Common Stock. (Rel. 34-36470)

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The <u>Chicago Board Options Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-95-54) to permit the Exchange to list and trade currency warrants based upon the value of the U.S. dollar in relation to the Brazilian Real. Publication of the notice is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of November 13. (Rel. 34-36464; International Series Rel. 879)

The <u>Pacific Stock Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-PSE-95-27) relating to the amendment of its Minor Rule Plan to include certain rules on financial reporting and cooperation in PSE investigations and the establishment of a charge for the late filing of periodic FOCUS Reports. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of November 13. (Rel. 34-36474)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change (SR-PHLX-95-33) filed by the <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> to limit the eligibility of National Over-the-Counter Index (XOC) options for execution through the automatic execution (AUTO-X) feature of the PHLX's Automated Options Market (AUTOM) system. Specifically, the PHLX proposal limits the AUTO-X eligibility of XOC options to XOC series where the bid is \$10 or less. XOC series where the bid is greater than \$10 will no longer be AUTO-X eligible and will be executed manually. Publication of the order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of November 13. (Rel. 34-36457)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-95-45) filed by the <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> relating to amendments to the eligibility provisions for members and associated persons found in Article II, Section 4 of the NASD By-Laws.
