SEC v. INTERNATIONAL HERITAGE, INC., ET AL., CASE NO. 1 98-CV-0803 RWS (N.D.GA.)

On April 3, the Honorable Richard W. Story, United States District Judge, issued an order finding, among other things, that the interests sold to representatives of International Heritage Inc. (IHI), were securities, as that term is defined in the federal securities laws, that the primary business of IHI was recruiting rather than selling products, and that the IHI program was fraudulent. Judge Story issued a preliminary injunction prohibiting IHI, its officers and agents from future violations of the federal securities laws, enjoining certain aspects of IHI's compensation plan, and appointing the receiver, Lloyd Whittaker, as a monitor of the firm. Upon the posting of a \$5 million bond, IHI's management will be permitted to take control of the company. However, before enlisting additional representatives, IHI is required to develop a compensation program which does not violate the Court's order and which is approved by the monitor.

On March 16, 1998, the Commission had filed a civil action in the Northern District of Georgia against IHI, Stanley H. Van Etten and others. IHI, based in Raleigh, North Carolina, purports to do business as a network marketing company, and operates a network of purportedly independent "sales representatives." IHI raised more than \$157 million from over 173,000 representatives. The Commission's complaint alleged, among other things, that IHI's program involved the sale of securities and that the program was fraudulent in that it functioned as a pyramid scheme.

IHI has been prohibited from enlisting new representatives since March 16, 1998. The Commission requests that any person who has been recruited since that time contact the Atlanta office of the Commission at (404) 842-7660. (Press Rel. 98-34)

CHAIRMAN LEVITT APPOINTS RICHARD WALKER AS DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION ENFORCEMENT

Chairman Levitt today appointed Richard H. Walker as Director of the Division of Enforcement. Mr. Walker succeeds William McLucas, who has served as director since December 1989.

Mr. Walker joined the Commission in 1991 and has served as General Counsel for the past two years. Prior to that, he was the Director of the Commission's Northeast Regional Office for four years. As General Counsel, Mr. Walker helped coordinate the government's successful appeal to the Supreme Court in <u>United States v. O'Hagan</u>, which upheld the misappropriation theory of insider trading. In addition, he oversaw the preparation of a report to the President and the Congress on the impact of the Private Securities Litigation Reform Act of 1995.

As director of the Commission's largest region, with offices in New York, Boston and Philadelphia, Mr. Walker supervised numerous important investigations and prosecutions, including ground breaking insider trading and municipal securities cases, and cases involving the fraudulent sale of securities by Towers Financial Corporation, The Foundation for New Era Philanthropy and Bennett Funding Corporation. He also was instrumental in supporting the United States Attorney for the Southern District of New York and the F.B.I. in a sting operation that netted 45 arrests in October of 1996 and has resulted in 30 Commission enforcement actions to date.

Chairman Levitt said, "Dick Walker represents a great combination of "outside" experience and "inside" knowledge. In private as well as public service, Dick has demonstrated his qood judqment, extraordinary intelligence and deep dedication to investor protection. Dick's talent as a litigator, and as a prosecutor, are remarkable. Throughout his service at the Commission, Dick has provided the most trusted and sage counsel to me and my fellow Commissioners."

Mr. Walker received the Presidential Rank Distinguished Service Award in 1997, the highest federal award for government service. He also received the Commission's Law and Policy Award in 1997 for his participation in <u>O'Hagan</u>. In 1997, he received the Chairman's Award for Excellence.

Prior to joining the Commission, Mr. Walker was a litigation partner for fifteen years in the New York office of Cadwalader, Wickersham & Taft. From 1975 to 1976, Mr. Walker served as law clerk to the Honorable Collins J. Seitz, former Chief Judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit. Mr. Walker is a 1972 Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Trinity College and a 1975 graduate, <u>cum</u> <u>laude</u>, of Temple Law School, where he served as Editor-in-Chief of the <u>Temple Law Quarterly</u>. ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

SEC v. GUOPING WU, JING XIAN AND DING SANG

On April 7, the Commission filed an insider trading complaint against Guoping Wu, also known as Daniel Wu; Jing Xian, also known as Jean Xian; and Ding Sang, also known as Daphne Sang. The Commission's complaint alleges that the defendants violated Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5

thereunder by trading in and/or tipping others to trade in the securities of Transport Holdings, Inc. (Transport) in advance of the September 26, 1996 public announcement that Transport would be acquired by Carmel, Indiana based Conseco, Inc. (Conseco). The complaint alleges that Wu learned of the Conseco-Transport acquisition while working at an actuarial firm that had been retained by Transport to perform services in connection with the acquisition. The complaint alleges that Wu then tipped Xian and Sanq, who purchased 700 and 500 shares of Transport stock respectively, and sold them after the September 26, 1996 public announcement for profits of \$14,389 and \$10,046.50 respectively. Simultaneously with the filing of the Commission's complaint, Wu, Xian, and Sang, without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, consented to the entry of permanent injunctions against them and agreed to pay a combined total of \$75,581.04 in disgorgement of illegal profits, prejudgment interest, and civil penalties. FIDELITY TRANSFER COMPANY AND LINDA KENER ENJOINED AND ORDERED TO PAY A CIVIL PENALTY OF \$5,000

The Commission announced that on March 4, 1998, the Honorable David Sam, U.S. District Judge for the District of Utah, issued an order of permanent injunction by consent against Fidelity Transfer Company (Fidelity) and Linda Kener (Kener), Fidelity's president. The Commission's complaint alleged that Fidelity violated certain rules and regulations governing transfer agents and that Kener aided and abetted those violations.

The final judgment, to which the defendants consented without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, orders that the defendants be permanently enjoined from committing violations of Section 17A(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and Rules 17Ad-2, 17Ad-6, and 17Ad-10 promulgated thereunder. In addition, the order requires Fidelity to pay a civil penalty of \$5,000. [SEC v. Fidelity Transfer Company and Linda Kener, USDC UT, Civil Action No. 93-C-868S] (LR-15698)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NATIONWIDE INVESTING FOUNDATION, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 27 to request a hearing on an application filed by Nationwide Investing Foundation, Nationwide Investing Foundation II, Nationwide Investing Foundation III, and Nationwide Separate Account Trust (collectively, Trusts), each of which is an open-end series investment company, and Nationwide Advisory Services, Inc., the investment adviser for each Trust, for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act. The order would grant an exemption from Section 15(a) of the Act and Rule 18f-2 under the Act to permit the various series of the Trusts to enter into and amend subadvisory agreements without obtaining shareholder approval. LIBERTY VARIABLE INVESTMENT TRUST, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 4, 1998, to request a hearing on an application filed by Liberty Variable Investment Trust (formerly Keyport Variable Investment Trust), Liberty Asset Management Company, and Liberty Advisory Services Corp. for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting applicants from Section 15(a) of the Act and Rule 18f-2 under the Act. The order would permit applicants to enter into and materially amend subadvisory agreements without obtaining shareholder approval. (Rel. IC-23105 - April 7)
