ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

PERMANENT INJUNCTIONS ENTERED AGAINST FIRST ZURICH NATIONAL USA, LLC, COMPUNOMICS 139, INC., AND PAUL CATCHINGS AND DISGORGEMENT OF \$4,370,425 ORDERED

The Commission announced that on July 22, 1998, a Judgement of Permanent Injunction (Order) was entered by default against defendants First Zurich National USA, LLC (First Zurich), Compunomics 139, Inc. (Compunomics), and Paul Douglas Catchings (Catchings), by the Honorable William F. Downes, of the U.S. District Court for the District of Wyoming.

The Order permanently enjoins the defendants from violations of the antifraud provisions of Sections 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, and Section 10(b) and Rule 10b-5 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Order requires the defendants to jointly and severally disgorge \$4,370,425 plus prejudgment and postjudgment interest to be determined later. The Order also requires defendant Catchings to pay a civil penalty of \$100,000.

In addition, the Order continues the appointment of the Special Officer appointed earlier by the Court to take possession of the business premises of First Zurich and Compunomics; requires the defendants to perform an accounting of investor funds; requires the defendants to repatriate investor funds to the U.S.; continues in effect a freeze of defendants' assets; orders Catchings to surrender his passport to the Court; and continues in effect a previous warrant issued for the arrest of Catchings based on the Court's finding him to be in contempt of various Court orders. COMMISSION OBTAINS PERMANENT INJUNCTION AND OTHER RELIEF AGAINST WESTVIEW CAPITAL, L.C., TRADING PARTNERS, L.C. AND TRADING PARTNERS II, L.C.

The Commission announced that on August 7 the Honorable William L. O'Steen, United States District Judge for the Middle District of North Carolina, entered an order of permanent injunction and other relief as to defendants Westview Capital, L.C. (Westview), Trading Partners, L.C. (TP) and Trading Partners II, L.C. (TP2). The order permanently enjoins and restrains Westview, TP and TP2 from future violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The order further enjoins and restrains Westview from future violations of Section 15(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

Westview was ordered to pay disgorgement in the amount of \$108,913.50, TP was ordered to pay disgorgement in the amount of \$2,041,510, and TP2 was ordered to pay disgorgement in the amount of \$995,735, with each amount representing the fees and commissions that entity received from the sales of interests in the limited liability companies outlined in the complaint along with prejudgment interest thereon. Payment of disgorgement and prejudgment interest was waived based upon each company's sworn statement which demonstrated an inability to pay the ordered amount. Civil penalties were not imposed based upon Westview's, TP's and TP2's demonstrated inability to pay.

Westview, TP and TP2, which are under the control of a court appointed Receiver, consented to the relief without admitting or denying the allegations set forth in the complaint, filed by the Commission on February 24, 1997. In its complaint, the Commission alleged that violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities by Marshall Melton and the defendant companies had occurred primarily between mid-1994 and late 1996. During that time, defendants Westview, TP and TP2 raised approximately \$5,000,000 from 44 investors, many of whom had invested in more than one of the entities. Through misrepresentations and omissions of material facts, Melton solicited and raised funds from unwitting investors. Among other violations, the investors were advised that their funds were being invested in specific investments when, in fact, Melton was commingling monies among the limited liability companies and using investors' funds to operate other entities he controlled. CERTAIN UNIT INVESTMENT TRUSTS, INSIDE EDGE COMMUNICATIONS SOUTHEAST, INC., HOLDING INTERNATIONAL CORP., DEREK BARTSCH, AND BURNELL HOEKSTRA TEMPORARILY RESTRAINED AND ASSETS FROZEN

The Commission announced that on August 11 the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida entered a Temporary Restraining Order and Other Relief against defendants Certain Unit Investment Trusts, Inside Edge Communications Southeast, Inc., Holding International Corp. (Holding Int'l), Derek Bartsch (Bartsch), and Burnell Hoekstra (Hoekstra), halting the offer or sale of fraudulent, unregistered securities through what the SEC alleges to be a boiler-room operation. The Court also froze the defendants' assets and appointed a receiver, who is now in possession of Holding Int'l's offices and its books and records.

According to the SEC's complaint, the defendants made material misrepresentations and omissions in connection with their sale of \$2.5 million in "units" to the investing public. The defendants represented to investors that the funds raised through these offerings would be used to establish a prepaid telephone service for "credit impaired" individuals and businesses. The complaint alleges that the defendants made false representations to investors regarding a joint venture or service agreement with a Californiabased telecommunications company. The complaint also alleges that the offering materials sent to investors contained baseless financial projections and material misrepresentations and omissions regarding the backgrounds of those associated with the offerings. The complaint further alleges that the defendants, unbeknownst to investors, intended to keep 70% to 85% of the funds raised as commissions, fees, and costs.

In addition to preliminary and permanent injunctions, the SEC's action also seeks disgorgement of ill-gotten profits against the defendants and money penalties against Bartsch and Hoekstra.

Named as relief defendants in the Commission's lawsuit are Capital Asset Allocators, Inc., The Inside Edge Communications, Inc., The Inside Edge Nationwide, Inc., and Trinity Alliance, Inc. [SEC v. Certain Unit Investment Trusts, et al., Case No. 98-1644-CIV-T-23-F, M.D. Fla.] (LR-15850)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ZURICH INSURANCE COMPANY, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 3, 1998, to request a hearing on an application filed by Zurich Insurance Company and Scudder Kemper Investments, Inc. (Scudder Kemper) for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 (Act) for an exemption from Section 15(a) of the Act. The order would permit the implementation without prior shareholder approval of new investment advisory and subadvisory agreements (New Advisory Agreements) for a period of up to 150 days following the later of: (i) consummation of the merger between Zurich Insurance Company and B.A.T Industries p.l.c., or (ii) the date on which the requested order is issued (but in no event later than March 31, 1999) (Interim Period). The order also would permit Scudder Kemper, following shareholder approval, to receive all fees earned under the New Advisory Agreements during the Interim Period. (Rel. IC-23389 -August 14)

THE GOLDMAN SACHS GROUP, L.P.

An order has been issued on an application filed by The Goldman Sachs Group, L.P. under Sections 6(b) and 6(e) of the Investment Company Act granting an exemption from all provisions of the Act, except Section 9 and Sections 36 through 53 of the Act, and the rules and regulations under those sections, with respect to certain investment vehicles (Funds), and granting an exemption from all provisions of the Act, except Section 9, certain provisions of Sections 17 and 30, and Sections 36 through 53 of the Act, and the rules and regulations under those sections, with respect to certain other Funds. Each Fund would be an "employees' securities company" within the meaning of Section 2(a)(13) of the Act. (IC-23390 -August 14)
