AMENDMENT OF RULES OF PRACTICE

The Commission is amending its Rules of Practice concerning submissions of petitions for rulemaking to state that such petitions may include either the text or substance of the proposed rule and to correct references to procedures followed by the Secretary after receipt of a petition. (Rel. 33-5958)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

COMMISSION DENIES ADVISERS ACT EXEMPTION SOUGHT BY HARBINE FINANCIAL SERVICE

The Commission has denied the application of Harbine Financial Service, a Closter, New Jersey, investment adviser, for an exemption of its proposed fee schedule from the provisions of the Investment Advisers Act. The proposed schedule would have violated the Act's prohibition of advisory contracts which compensate the adviser on the basis of a share of the capital gains on a client's funds.

The Commission noted that such profit-sharing arrangements encourage advisers to take undue risks with their clients' funds, and tempt advisers to time transactions on the basis of their own compensation rather than their clients' best interests. It stated: "We do not question [Harbine's] honesty in past dealings, or [its] good intentions. However, [the Act's prohibition] is a prophylactic measure designed to ensure that an investment adviser's decisions to buy, sell or hold a security are based on the best interests of his client and not on his own compensation We cannot accept [Harbine's] contention that, [if an exemption is granted], there will be no potential for abuse." DOMINION BANKSHARES CORPORATION

The Commission has instituted proceedings pursuant to Section 15(c)(4) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 to determine whether certain filings of Dominion Bankshares Corporation failed to comply in any material respect with the reporting provisions of Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act and the rules promulgated thereunder. Simultaneously with the institution of these proceedings, the Commission accepted an offer of settlement from Dominion. Without admitting or denying the findings made by the Commission, Dominion consented to the Findings and Order wherein Dominion was: (1) found to have filed with the Commission an annual report which failed to disclose material transactions involving officers of Dominion and a wholly-owned subsidiary of Dominion; and (2) ordered to file with the Commission a report on Form 8-K as to the foregoing transactions. COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

CHAIRMAN WILLIAMS SPEAKS BEFORE THE AMERICAN ACCOUNTING ASSOCIATION

Chairman Williams spoke before The American Accounting Association in Denver, Colo., on Tuesday, August 22, 1978. The title of his address was "The Changing World of the Accountants: Where The Next Steps Should Lead."

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

CHARLES R. ALLEN ENJOINED

The Washington Regional Office announced that on August 11 Judge John Feikens of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Michigan, Southern Division, entered a judgment of permanent injunction, by consent, against Charles R. Allen of Parkersburg, West Virginia, enjoining him from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The defendant consented to the entry of the Court's final judgment without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the Commission's complaint. Additionally, the Court ordered that Charles R. Allen disgorge a total of \$15,000 payable on or before August 11, 1983 into its Registry Fund, to be disbursed pursuant to a plan to be submitted to the Court by the Commission. (SEC v. Associated Minerals, Inc., et al., E.D. Mich., S. Div., Civil Action No. 77-0986). (LR-8511)

HAROLD E. PRAY SENTENCED

The Washington Regional Office and the Philadelphia Branch Office announced that on July 31 U.S. District Court Judge Malcolm Muir sentenced Harold E. Pray to eighteen months incarceration for violation of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Pray had been charged in a fourteen-count indictment with converting money and securities of customers of Harold E. Pray Investment Securities, a now defunct broker-dealer of which Pray was the managing partner. On June 8, during the second day of trial, Pray pleaded guilty to the first count of the indictment charging him with converting \$25,000, which had been entrusted to him by a customer for the purpose of purchasing mutual funds. The twelve remaining counts of the indictment were dismissed after entry of the guilty plea. One count of the indictment previously had been dismissed by the court as a result of Pray's pretrial motions. Pray began serving his sentence on August 14. (U.S. v. Harold E. Pray, M.D. Pa., Civil Action No. 78-20). (LR-8512)
