#### COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

COMMISSION ISSUES ACCOUNTING SERIES RELEASE ON CATASTROPHE RESERVES OF CASUALTY INSURANCE COMPANIES. The Commission today issued an Accounting Series Release providing for comprehensive disclosure of catastrophe reserves established by property and casualty insurance companies. The release calls attention to the fact that some companies in this industry have been providing such reserves to cover major losses which occur irregularly while other companies have not, and it encourages efforts by the industry and the accounting profession to arrive at a single acceptable accounting approach to such losses. In the meantime, full disclosure of the accounting being followed and the dollar impact of that accounting on reported income and liabilities is required. (Acct. Rel. No. 134)

EXTENSION OF DEADLINES CONTAINED IN RULE 17a-15. The SEC has extended from December 26, 1972 until-January 26, 1973 the deadline by which each registered national securities exchange and national securities association must file with the Commission a plan pursuant to Rule 17a-15 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Rule") for the reporting of prices and volume of completed transactions in listed securities ("last sale reports"). Adoption of the Rule was announced on November 8, 1972 in Securities Exchange Act Release No. 9850. The Commission has also extended from January 22, 1973 until February 26, 1973 the Rule's prohibition against releasing last sale reports on a current and continuing basis without an effective plan. The Commission has determined to extend these deadlines in view of the complexities involved in developing such plans and after having been advised that substantial progress has been made in this regard. CHICAGO BOARD OPTIONS EXCHANGE, INC. EXTENDS FILING. The Chicago Board Options Exchange, Inc. consented to the Commission deferring action on its application for registration as a national securities exchange pursuant to Section 6 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, for an additional 14 days from and after January 2, 1973.

As previously announced by the Commission, the application and exhibits are available for public inspection in the Public Reference Section of the Commission's Headquarters Office and all interested persons may submit their views and comments on the above proposals in writing to the Securities and Exchange Commission, Washington, D.C. 20549. All communications with respect to the proposed registration should refer to File No. 10-54-1 and/all such communications will be available for public inspection.

### COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

SIX ENJOINED IN LOUISIANA. The SEC FortWorth Regional Office announced on December 5 that the Federal court in Lake Charles, La., permanently enjoined Winfield R. Lank, Lafayette, Louisiana, Don L. Williams, West Monroe, Louisiana, Louis A. Kimball, Shreveport, Louisiana, Walter H. Johnson and Warren L. Spillers, both of Monroe, Louisiana, and Melvin H. Pohlman of Gretna, Louisiana from violations of the anti-fraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 in the offer and sale of 8% notes of Affiliated Investment Corporation. (LR-5681)
