U.S. SECURITIES AND

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EXCHANGE COMMISSION INJUNCTIVE ACTION NAMES BOC INTERNATIONAL LTD., BOC FINANCIAL CORP.

The SEC announced the filing of a civil injunctive action, in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, against BOC International Limited (BOC Ltd.), a United Kingdom corporation headquartered in London, England, and its wholly-owned subsidiary, BOC Financial Corporation (BOCF), a Delaware corporation. The defendants are charged with violations of the tender offer provisions (Sections 14(d) and 14(e)) and other reporting provisions (Section 13(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934). The Commission's allegations deal with the events during and after BOCF's January 1978 tender offer for shares of common stock of Airco, Inc. (Airco), then listed on the New York Stock Exchange. Simultaneously with the filing of the complaint, the defendants, without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, entered into a settlement with the Commission. The settlement has been approved by U.S. District Judge Laurence W. Pierce. (SEC v. BOC International Limited, et al., S.D.N.Y., 79 Civ. 0888). (LR-8673)
