COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

FILES ON CORPORATE PAYMENTS MADE PUBLIC

The Commission, pursuant to requests under the Freedom of Information Act, has made available to the public certain previously non-public files in its possession relating to questionable corporate payments. Files concerning the following corporation will be made available beginning today: Exxon Corporation. ADDITIONAL ORGANIZATIONAL CHANGES ANNOUNCED FOR THE DIVISION OF MARKET REGULATION

Andrew M. Klein, Director of the Division of Market Regulation today announced the creation of an inspection unit Within the Division's Office of Self-Regulatory Oversight. The inspection unit will directly oversee the performance of national securities exchanges and the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. in discharging their responsibilities under the Securities Exchange Act.

Thomas J. Loughran has been appointed Assistant Director in charge of this inspection unit. Mr. Loughran was graduated with honors from the University of Notre Dame and the University of Santa Clara School of Law. He joined the Commission's Division of Enforcement where he served as a staff attorney, Chief of the Branch of Municipal Securities Enforcement and Chief of the Branch of Market Surveillance. Most recently, he served as Assistant Director for Sales Practices of the Commission's Special Study of the Options Markets. He is a member of the Maryland Bar.

STOCK TRANSACTIONS OF SELECTED FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND FOREIGN INVESTORS, FIRST THREE QUARTERS OF 1978

According to estimates released by the SEC, private noninsured pension funds, openend investment companies, life insurance companies and property-liability insurance companies purchased \$34.2 billion of common stock and sold \$32.2 billion during the first nine months of 1978, resulting in net purchases of \$2.0 billion. During the first three quarters of 1977, purchases were \$27.7 billion; sales were \$25.7 billion and net purchases remained \$2.0 billion. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

L. BLAINE LILJENQUIST PLEADS GUILTY

The Washington Regional Office announced that on May 14 L. Blaine Liljenquist of McLean, Virginia, pleaded guilty before Chief Judge Albert V. Bryan, Jr. in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, Alexandria Division, to a charge of violating the registration provisions of the securities laws. A four count indictment had been returned against Liljenquist by a federal grand jury sitting in Alexandria on May 9, which charged him with two counts of selling unregistered securities, one count of conspiracy to violate the registration provisions, and one count of securities fraud. The indictment centered around sales and delivery of unregistered common stock of Research Homes, Inc., a company engaged in the development and sale of real estate between 1971 and 1976. It alleged a conspiracy to disguise the actual number and identity of shareholders from the Commission, as well as from the company's own auditors and attorneys, through nominee procedures. The indictment also alleges that as part of his scheme to sell the unregistered securities, Liljenquist sold more stock than he owned or possessed.

On motion of the U.S. Attorney, the court dismissed the remaining three counts of the indictment. Judge Bryan set sentencing for June 15. (U.S. v. L. Blaine Liljenquist, Criminal No. 78-86-A, E.D. Va.). (LR-8755)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE TRAVELERS INSURANCE COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 11 to request a hearing on an application of the Travelers Insurance Company and its Funds A and A-1 for Variable Annuities, two registered open-end diversified management companies, requesting an order pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 granting exemptions from Sections 26(a)(2) and 27(c)(2) of the Act to permit the imposition of an annual contract charge on certain group variable annuity contracts. EDIE SPECIAL GROWTH FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 11 to request a hearing on an application of Edie Special Growth Fund, Inc. (Growth Fund), Rowe Price New Horizons Fund, Inc. (New Horizons), registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940 as open-end, diversified, management investment companies, and T. Rowe Price Associates, Inc., the investment adviser of Growth Fund and New Horizons, for an order exempting from Section 17(a) of the Act and permitting under Rule 17d-1 of the Act a proposed reorganization of Growth Fund and New Horizons. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALLEGHENY POWER SYSTEM, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal of Allegheny Power System, Inc., a registered holding company, to become bonded as surety to the State of West Virginia in such amount, expected not to exceed \$31 million, as shall be determined by the West Virginia Public Service Commission (WVPSC), said bond being required by the WVPSC in connection with collection of increased rates and charges pursuant to certain tariff sheets filed with the WVPSC by Allegheny's wholly-owned subsidiary, Monongahela Power Company. INDIANA & MICHIGAN ELECTRIC COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal of Indiana & Michigan Electric Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., concerning the financing of pollution control facilities. (Rel. 35-21048 - May 16)

PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY OF OKLAHOMA

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing a proposal of Public Service Company of Oklahoma (PSO), subsidiary of Central and South West Corporation, and PSO's subsidiary, Ash Creek Mining Company, that PSO's existing short-term loans to finance Ash Creek be extended until December 31, 1979. Such loan shall not exceed \$1,250,000 and shall be used only for maintenance and related administrative tasks for the Ash Creek facility. (Rel. 35-21049 - May 16)
