RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

DESIGNATION OF NATIONAL MARKET SYSTEM SECURITIES

The Commission has issued a release adopting two amendments to Rule 11Aa2-1 (Qualified Securities Rule) under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and granting an exemption to the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (NASD) from certain provisions of Rule 11Aa3-1 (Transaction Reporting Rule) under the Act. The first amendment defers the effective date of Tier 1 under the Qualified Securities Rule until April 1, 1982. The second amendment defers the effective date of Tier 2 under that rule until October 1, 1982. In addition, the NASD is exempted until May 15, 1982 from providing last sale reports over its NASDAQ Level I service for national market system securities to vendors of securities transaction information. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CIVIL INJUNCTIVE ACTION FILED AGAINST WALES RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT, OTHERS

The Chicago and Seattle Regional Offices announced that on February 1 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the District of Oregon seeking permanent injunctions against Wales Research and Development, Richard L. Wales, Beverly A. Wales and William L. Wales (defendants), alleging violations of the registration and anti-fraud provisions of the Federal securities laws. The complaint alleges, among other things, that the defendants, in the offer and sale of fractional undivided interests in a non-combustion motor, made untrue statements of material facts and omitted to state material facts concerning, but not limited to, the use of proceeds raised from investors, the compensation paid to securities salesmen, and the state of research and development, the patentability and the valuation of the non-combustion motor.

In addition to the permanent injunctions, the complaint also seeks an accounting of all funds received from securities holders and all other sources, the uses to which such funds were put, the amounts of any remaining such funds and their location, and accountings of all assets and liabilities of each defendant.
