## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

JOHN O. SCHOFIELD, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on May 19 the Honorable Joel M. Flaum, Judge, U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, entered Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction against John O. Schofield Inc., Duke Resources, and John O. Schofield. The defendants consented to the injunctions without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint. The judgments enjoin the defendants from violating the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. plaint alleged that defendants made misrepresentations concerning the existence of escrow and separate accounts and the distribution of financial information. It was also alleged that defendants omitted to tell investors the cost of drilling and completing wells and failed to inform investors that they were commingling investors (SEC v. John O. Schofield Inc., et al., U.S.D.C. N.D. IL, Eastern Division, Civil Action No. 82C3129). (LR-9681)

## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES
