NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

Following is a schedule of Commission meetings which will be conducted pursuant to provisions of the Government in the Sunshine Act. In general, the Commission expects to follow a schedule of holding closed meetings on Tuesdays, and open meetings on Thursday morning. Meetings on Wednesday, and if necessary on Thursday afternoons, will be either open or closed according to the requirements of agenda items under consideration. The Commission will not normally meet on Mondays or Fridays.

Visitors are welcome at all open meetings, insofar as space is available.

Meetings will be held in the Commission Meeting Room, Room 1C30, at the Commission's headquarters building, 450 Fifth Street, N.W., Washington, DC. The subject matter of the November 2 closed meeting will be: Regulatory matter bearing enforcement implications; Institution of injunctive actions and administrative proceedings of an enforcement nature; Report of investigation.

CLOSED MEETING - WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 1982 - 10:00 A.M.

The subject matter of the November 3 closed meeting will be: Formal orders of investigation; Regulatory matter regarding financial institution; Opinion.

OPEN MEETING - THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 4, 1982 - 10:00 A.M.

The subject matter of the November 4 open meeting will be:

(1) Consideration of whether to issue an order authorizing the Louisiana Power & Light Company, an electric utility subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., a registered holding company under the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935 to acquire the municipal electric system of the City of Monroe, Louisiana. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

SAXON INDUSTRIES, INC. AND ARTHUR MONTEIL ENJOINED

The New York Regional Office announced that on October 6 the Honorable Robert J. Ward entered Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction against Saxon Industries, Inc. and Arthur Monteil, a former officer. Saxon and Monteil, without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, consented to the entry of the Final Judgment which enjoins them from violating and aiding and abetting violations of Sections 10(b), 13(a), 13(b)(2) and 14(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and rules promulgated thereunder.

The Commission's complaint, filed on September 9 against Saxon, Monteil and two other defendants, Alfred Horowitz, formerly vice president-finance at Saxon's Corporate Headquarters in New York, and Stanley Lurie, Saxon's former president, chief operating officer and chairman of its board of directors, alleged that the books and records of Saxon were knowingly and wilfully falsified by Monteil, among others, who was vice president finance at Saxon's Business Products Division in Miami Lakes, Florida. As alleged in the complaint, the scheme to falsify Saxon's books and records began as early as 1968 and continued through Saxon's filing for reorganization in April of this year. The scheme was carried out by the creation of non-existent inventory on the records of various Saxon divisions, including Business Products. By 1981, the books and records of the Business Products Division carried approximately \$65 million in non-existent inventory.

The Commission's complaint further alleged that, as a result of the inventory falsifications, among other things, the financial information filed with the Commission in annual and quarterly reports was materially false and misleading. In addition, it was alleged that during a proxy contest in 1981, Saxon's proxy solicitations were based on such false and misleading financial information. (SEC v. Saxon Industries, Inc., et al., 82 Civ. 5992, S.D.N.Y.). (LR-9790)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A fee change filed by the Midwest Securities Trust Company, pursuant to Rule 19b-4, (SR-MSTC-82-21) has become effective in accordance with Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposed rule change revises MSTC's current fees for the storage and safekeeping of participants' municipal securities. Previously, MSTC charged a flat fee based on the total value of each participant's securities stored with MSTC. The proposed rule change, however, reduces the aggregate amount charged each participant per security issue by establishing a scaled fee that declines as the value of the participant's position in a security increases. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of October 12. (Rel. 34-19166)
