### REQUEST FOR COMMENT ON ACCOUNTING FOR RETURN OF A NONACCRUAL LOAN TO ACCRUAL STATUS AFTER A PARTIAL CHARGE-OFF

The Commission issued a request for public comment on whether an accounting method being proposed by the Federal Financial Institutions Examination Council (FFIEC) would be acceptable in financial statements filed with the Commission by bank or thrift holding companies. The FFIEC is proposing, for purposes of reporting to federal banking and thrift regulators, to establish criteria under which a depository institution may return a nonaccrual loan to accrual status, even though full recovery of the loan's contractual principal amount may not be expected. Comment letters should be received on or before 45 days after publication in the Federal Register. Such letters should be submitted in triplicate to Jonathan G. Katz, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 450 Fifth Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20549, and should refer to File No. S7-5-91 (Rel. Nos. 33-6886; 34-28969; File No. S7-5-91). ## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

### NASD ACTION AGAINST BRIAN ALLEN AFFIRMED

The Commission has affirmed sanctions imposed by the NASD on Brian G. Allen, of Silver Spring, Maryland. Allen was formerly associated with Eneric Financial Services, Inc., an NASD member firm. The NASD censured Allen, fined him \$5,000 and barred him from association with any member.

The Commission found, as had the NASD, that Allen forged a check payable to himself from an affiliate of his employer and converted the proceeds. In affirming the sanctions imposed by the NASD, the Commission noted that "there can hardly be more serious misconduct in the securities business than forgery and theft." (Rel. 34-28925)
