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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### STOP ORDER ISSUED AGAINST ORTHOMOLECULAR, INC.

The Commission issued a Stop Order suspending the effectiveness of the registration statement filed by Orthomolecular, Inc. of Lander, Wyoming. Orthomolecular, without admitting or denying the allegations, consented to the issuance of the Stop Order.

The Commission found that the registration statement filed by Orthomolecular contained untrue, false and misleading statements and omissions concerning, among other things: (a) the eligibility of the "Libby Technique" for health insurance coverage, the charges which will be covered by patient health insurance, type of treatment rendered patients, and effectiveness of such technique for drug related problems; (b) the circumstances under which billings for patients were prepared and submitted to insurance carriers and the fact that certain such billings are false, misleading or unsubstantiated regarding the true identity of the provider, the type of services performed, services actually rendered and accommodations provided patients; (c) the nature of the charges for treatment of patients involving the "Libby Technique" and a description of competitive programs which are recognized, accredited and medically accepted; (d) the affiliation of, loans to, stock ownership of, agreements with, payments to, and involvement of Dr. A. Scott DeVous of Green River, Wyoming with the Registrant and John L. Vidakovich, president of Registrant; Dr. DeVous' background, the number of patients he referred to the program, the circumstances of the referrals, illnesses treated, and the impact of the referrals upon Registrant's income; (e) the results of treatment of and subsequent hospitalization required for certain patients

and the lack of follow-up care; (f) investigations or inquiries being conducted or reasonably anticipated to be conducted by insurance carriers and others concerning billings for patients which have been submitted for payment and impact on Registrant's operations; and (g) possible future contingent liability of Registrant. 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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

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### COMPLAINT NAMES UNITED STATES SURGICAL CORPORATION, OTHERS

The Commission today filed a civil action against United States Surgical Corporation of Norwalk, Connecticut, Leon C. Hirsch, Turi Josefsen, Bruce S. Lustman, Howard M. Rosenkrantz, Thomas D. Guy, Herbert W. Korhoff, and Wilson F. Smith, Jr. alleging violations of the antifraud, reporting, accounting and proxy provisions of the securities laws. The defendants consented to the Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction and other Equitable Relief without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint.

The complaint alleges that: beginning at least in 1979 and continuing in 1980 and 1981, the defendants variously engaged in numerous practices under which Surgical's earnings and financial condition were materially overstated (certain of these practices continued during 1982 and 1983); the objective of these practices was to report steadily increasing earnings and an improved financial condition when, in fact, such was not the case; and the defendants variously engaged in false and misleading financial reporting and made false and misleading disclosures in filings with the Commission and documents disseminated to shareholders. 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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### MIDDLE SOUTH UTILITIES, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued giving interested persons until March 19 to request a hearing on a proposal by Middle South Energy, Inc., a wholly-owned subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to issue and sell 100,000 shares of its common stock to the holding company from time to time through December 31, 1984. ### WEST TEXAS UTILITIES COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Central and South West Corporation to make equity investments in three of its subsidiaries either through cash capital contributions or purchases of common stock during 1984 and 1985. The total amounts of the equity investments authorized are up to \$60 million for West Texas Utilities Company, \$150 million for Central Power & Light Company and \$20 million for Southwestern Electric Company.
