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## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

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### RULE AMENDMENTS TO ESTABLISH SHORT SALE REGULATIONS PROPOSED

The Commission today announced that it was proposing amendments to Securities Exchange Act Rules 3b-3, 10a-1 and 10a-2 to establish comprehensive short sale regulation for securities which will be traded in the planned central market system for listed securities. The Commission had indicated in its Policy Statement on the Structure of a Central Market System (March 29, 1973) that the adoption of more complete and effective short sale regulation was one of the first of a series of steps the Commission had under consideration to implement the proposals made therein, particularly in view of current plans to implement a composite last sale reporting system. The amendments announced today reflect the recommendations made to the Commission in its Advisory Committee on a Central Market System which are contained in that Committee's Interim Report to the Commission on Regulation Needed to Implement a Composite Transaction Reporting System (Oct. 11, 1972). The Commission also requested comment on certain aspects of the Advisory Committee's proposed approach as well as on certain alternative proposals which have been made. 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## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

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### B-D MODEL COMPLIANCE PROGRAM MEETING TO BE HELD MAR. 20

The Commission's Advisory Committee on a Model Compliance Program for broker-dealers, established October 25, 1972 (Rel. 34-9835), will hold a meeting to begin at 10:30 a.m. local time on March 20, 1974 in Rm. 858, Securities and Exchange Commission, 500 North Capitol St., Washington, D. C. This meeting is to consider the Preliminary Draft of the Guide and to discuss matters relating to the further work of the Committee. Any interested person may attend or file statements with the Committee. If in written form, the statements may be filed before or after the meeting. Oral statements may be made at the time and in the manner permitted by the Committee.

The Committee was formed to assist the Commission in developing a model compliance program to serve as an industry guide for the broker-dealer community. Assisted by this Committee's work, the Commission plans to publish a guide to broker-dealer compliance under the securities acts to advise broker-dealers of the standards to which they should adhere if investor confidence in the fairness of the market place is to be warranted and sustained. The Committee's recommendations are not intended to result in the expansion of Commission rules governing broker-dealers, but to inform broker-dealers of existing requirements and how they may comply with them.

## COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

### COMPLAINT NAMES SEABOARD CORP., OTHERS

The Division of Enforcement and the Los Angeles Regional Office announced the filing of a complaint in the U. S. District Court at Los Angeles seeking to enjoin The Seaboard Corporation (Seaboard), of Beverly Hills, Cal; and twenty-eight other defendants from violations of the securities laws, seeking receivers for Seaboard and four registered investment companies formerly managed by Seaboard subsidiaries, and also seeking other ancillary relief.

In addition to Seaboard, the defendants are: Three subsidiaries of Seaboard: Competitive Capital Corporation, All States Management Company, and Boston Administrative & Research, Inc., that were, until recently, engaged in the business of managing mutual funds; Irwin Solomon, John Coe, Peter Landau and Billy Steele who were or are now officers or directors of Seaboard; Cantor, Fitzgerald & Co., Inc., a broker-dealer of Beverly Hills, and five officers of Cantor's: B. Gerald Cantor, Michael Heflin, Michael Z. Landy, James M. Mallick and Bertram Singer; Steinhardt, Fine, Berkowitz & Co., (SFB), a New York based investment partnership; and Michael Steinhardt, a general partner of SFB; Jerome Robert Randolph, of Los Angeles; Chancellor Management Corporation, an investment adviser owned by Randolph; John R. Rawlings, III, of Los Angeles; and Harry B. Turner, of Santa Barbara; Rittmaster, Lawrence & Co., Inc., a broker-dealer of New York City; and two of its principals, Lee Lawrence and Arthur Rittmaster; Norton, Daniels & Co., Inc., a Los Angeles based financial public relations firm; and Fran Daniels, its president; and the registered investment companies formally managed by Seaboard subsidiaries: Competitive Capital Fund, Inc., Seaboard Leverage Fund, Inc., Admiralty Fund, Inc., and The Income Fund of Boston, Inc.

The Commission's complaint focuses on two areas of alleged illegal conduct: (a) a 1970 offering of Seaboard securities and misuse of Seaboard and Seaboard managed investment company monies in the cover up; and (b) mismanagement of the investment companies formerly managed by Seaboard. It also alleges that the investment companies managed by Seaboard lost at least \$9,000,000.

In a related matter, the New York Regional Office and the Division of Enforcement announced the filing of an injunctive action against Hayden, Stone, Inc. (Hayden), registered broker-dealer of New York City, and Marshall Cogan (Cogan), a former officer of Hayden and a resident of New York City, in the U. S. District Court for New York. The complaint alleges violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws on the part of Hayden and Cogan in the January 1970 offering of Seaboard securities. The principal allegations are that Hayden and Cogan failed to disclose certain facts to purchasers in the offering and improperly sold certain of the securities to Hayden's discretionary accounts.

In regard to these two suits the Commission has entered into stipulations and consents with Cantor, Fitzgerald & Co., Inc., B. G. Cantor, Hayden, Stone, Inc. and Marshall Cogan. All of these parties have agreed to an injunction against violations of the securities laws and to the institution of administrative proceedings which impose sanctions. Cantor, Fitzgerald has consented to a ninety day suspension of its institutional trading department but the suspension will not become operative as long as at the close of the ninety day period Cantor, Fitzgerald pays its profits from that department, but in no event less than \$265,000, into the court to be paid out later under a plan. B. G. Cantor has consented to a censure.

Hayden consented to suspension from managing registered underwritings for a period of sixty days. In addition, Hayden has agreed to establish a fund of \$300,000 to be paid to purchasers in the Seaboard offering.

Cogan has consented to a nine months suspension from association with a broker-dealer and a suspension for an indefinite period from managing discretionary securities brokerage accounts.

In a related matter, the Commission has accepted, pending its formal order, offers of settlement from P. N. MacIntyre & Co., Inc. (PNM), Patrick MacIntyre, and Adolph Mora, of Los Angeles, California. The charges against them grew out of the Commission's investigation of Seaboard and relate to trading and underwriting activities. PNM, MacIntyre and Mora consented to finding by the Commission that they violated the securities laws and PNM has consented to a revocation of its broker-dealer registration, MacIntyre to a bar from association with a broker-dealer and Mora to a one month suspension from association with a broker-dealer.

#### ALLSTATE LEASING AND ACCEPTANCE CORPORATION, OTHERS ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on February 26 the Federal court in Atlanta permanently enjoined Allstate Leasing and Acceptance Corporation, a Georgia corporation, Allstate Leasing and Acceptance Corporation, a Tennessee corporation, Allstate Leasing and Acceptance Corporation, a North Carolina corporation, Rex Thorn, of Atlanta, president, and M. Catherine Thorn, of Atlanta, secretary-treasurer of the three Allstate corporations, from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in offers and sales of investment notes of the three Allstate corporations. On the same day a receiver was appointed for each of the Allstate corporations. The defendants consented to the injunction and order appointing the receiver without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint. (LR-6267)

#### JERRY McFARLAND ENJOINED

The Denver Regional Office announced that on February 25 the Federal court in El Paso, Texas permanently enjoined Jerry A. McFarland of Denver, Colorado from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the unregistered and fraudulent distribution of beneficial interests in trust funds, investment contracts, notes and evidences of indebtedness of Bankers Trust Company, Inc. of New Mexico. 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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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#### LOUISIANA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Louisiana Power & Light Company, subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to issue and sell at competitive bidding \$45 million principal amount of first mortgage bonds, due 2004 and 100,000 shares of a new series of cumulative preferred stock (\$100 par). (Rel. 35-18301)

#### THE COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM

An order has been issued authorizing The Columbia Gas System, Inc., a registered holding company, to amend its Certificate of Incorporation to (a) increase authorized common stock from 39,500,000 to 50,000,000 shares, (b) increase authorized preferred stock from 500,000 to 10,000,000 shares, and (c) alter the rights and privileges of its preferred stock to accord with the Commission's Statement of Policy. In connection with these amendments, authority has been given to solicit by proxy the consents of its common stockholders. (Rel. 35-18304)
