COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

INITIAL DECISION SUSPENDS EFFECTIVENESS OF REGISTRATION STATEMENT FILED BY CROYLE COMPUTER SERVICES, INC.

Administrative Law Judge Sidney L. Feiler has filed an initial decision suspending the effectiveness of a registration statement filed by Croyle Computer Services, Inc., Phoenix, Arizona. The decision was based upon findings that the registration statement contained serious deficiencies which rendered it inaccurate and misleading. The administrative law judge noted that Croyle had attempted to remedy deficiencies by amendment, but concluded that serious deficiencies still remained which required the issuance of the order of suspension. The decision is subject to review by the Commission on petition of a party or on its own motion.

DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

LOWENTHAL, HALE, JAFFE, INC. REVOKED, EUGENE JAFFE AND ALBERT HALEGOUA SANCTIONED

An order has been issued revoking the broker-dealer registration of Lowenthal, Hale, Jaffe, Inc. of <u>Philadelphia, Pennsylvania</u>, and expelling the firm from membership in the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. That order also suspended Eugene Jaffe, the firm's president and sole stockholder, and Albert Halequua (also known as Albert Hale), a former salesman for the firm, from being associated with any broker-dealer for a period of 90 days commencing June 10, 1974, and thereafter barred from being so associated except as a supervised employee in a non-supervisory capacity upon a showing to the Commission that they will be adequately supervised.

The sanctions were based on findings that the respondents had been permanently enjoined by the U. S. District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania from violating the net capital, record-keeping and credit extension provisions of the Exchange Act. In addition, the respondents offered and sold unregistered securities of T. A. Kirk Gas Unit and made misrepresentations to purchasers in such sales, which included the firm's willingness to guarantee the purchasers against losses, the purchasers' ability to recoup their initial investments and how much income the purchasers could anticipate. Respondents were found to have violated the net capital, record-keeping and credit extension provisions of the Exchange Act and Regulation T of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System.

The Commission's action was based on offers of settlement in which respondents, without admitting or denying the charges, consented to the findings and sanctions. (Rel. 34-10844)

SOL JAY RIFKIN D/B/A THE CSP ADVISOR SUSPENDED

An order has been issued suspending Sol Jay Rifkin, of Forest Hills, New York, doing business as The CSP Advisor, for a period of 60 days from being associated with any investment adviser and prohibiting him from advertising his service for an additional four-month period thereafter. Rifkin may, however, provide service without charge to existing subscribers during the suspension period.

The sanction was based on findings that Rifkin published advertisements in newspapers and periodicals for his investment advisory service designed to solicit subscribers by promising substantial profits, using deceptive language and format, referring to past recommendations which contained false statements about those recommendations, representing that certain services would be provided free of charge when prior subscription was actually necessary to obtain such services and by inadequately warning such potential clients of the complexities and risks involved in the making of investment decisions.

The Commission's action was based on an offer of settlement in which Rifkin, without admitting or denying the charges against him, consented to the findings and sanction. (Rel. IA-417)

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

COMPLAINT NAMES ROBT. DALE JOHNSON, RIDGE ASSOCIATES & CO., OTHERS

The Washington Regional Office on June 14 announced the filing of a complaint in the U. S. District Court in Alexandria, Virginia seeking to enjoin Robert Dale Johnson, Ridge Associates & Co., John D. Schrott, Jr., Vortex Corporation, Resource Evaluation and Development, Inc., and Canal Corporation, all of McLean, Virginia, Thomas W. Gilliam, Jr., Erle Cocke, Jr., both of Washington, D.C., Jack O. Friedman, Charleston, West Virginia, Joseph M. Holt, Jr., Lewisburg, West Virginia, Frank E. Mower, II, Virginia Beach, Virginia and James L. Phillips, Arlington, Virginia. The complaint alleges that Robert Dale Johnson and Ridge Associates & Co. violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws and that all other defendants violated the registration provisions.

The complaint alleges that the defendants have offered and sold promissory notes to some 400 investors without compliance with the registration requirements of the securities laws. It also alleges that in the offer and sale of these securities Johnson and Ridge Associates engaged in a scheme to defraud investors whereby investors were actively solicited to invest in certain promissory notes of Johnson upon the representation that such funds would be used to purchase industrial wine in Europe so that such wine could be sold at a profit; whereas Johnson and Ridge Associates were in fact engaged in a multi million dollar Ponzi scheme or sham whereby wine contract obligations, which included the return to investors of principal invested and profits ranging from 30 to 100 percent, were being paid off with the funds of other investors. JOSEPH WARREN DESMOND, OTHERS, ENJOINED; DESMOND SENTENCED

The Seattle Regional Office announced that on May 20 the Federal District Court Judge for the Eastern District of Washington permanently enjoined Joseph Warren Desmond, West-Mont Oil, Inc., and Raywood Placers, Ltd., from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the sale of securities of West-Mont Oil, Inc., Passport Mines Ltd., and Raywood Placers, Ltd., or any other security. The order was entered following a hearing on the Commission's motion for default judgment.

Additionally, on May 21, 1974 and March 13, 1974 Ray G. Bohn and Canarim Investment Corporation, Ltd., respectively, were permanently enjoined from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the above securities. The defendants consented to the injunctions without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint. (LR-6396)

The Regional office also announced that a Superior Court Judge on May 29 sentenced Warren Desmond to six months in jail and five years probation after Desmond pleaded guilty to two counts of stock fraud. The sentence also included a \$500 fine and restitution. (LR-6397)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MICHIGAN CONSOLIDATED GAS COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 12 to request a hearing on an application of Michigan Consolidated Gas Company, subsidiary of American Natural Gas Company, to sell \$40 million of first mortgage bonds at competitive bidding. (Rel. 35-18461)

PENNSYLVANIA ELECTRIC COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Pennsylvania Electric Company (Penelec), subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, to sell \$50 million of first mortgage bonds. Penelec received two independent bids, one for \$50 million principal amount and the other for \$30 million principal amount. Penelec proposes to accept said bid for \$50 million. (Rel. 35-18458)

GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing General Public Utilities Corporation (GPU), a registered holding company, to vary the portions of unsecured promissory notes which are sold as commercial paper and those which are issued to evidence bank loans. (Rel. 34-18457)

SYSTEM FUELS

The SEC has issued a notice giving interested persons until July 11 to request a hearing on a proposal of System Fuels, Inc., a jointly-owned non-utility subsidiary of the operating electric utility subsidiary companies of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to lease two oil storage tanks and related facilities from Unilease No. 10, Inc., a non-affiliated single purpose leasing company. The facilities, now owned by Louisiana Power & Light Company, an associate company of the Middle South System, will be acquired by Unilease for approximately \$5.3 million. (Rel. 35-18459)

The SEC has announced the suspension of exchange and over-the-counter trading in the securities of Canadian Javelin, Ltd., and over-the-counter trading in the securities of Royal Properties, Inc. for the further ten-day period June 17-26, inclusive.
