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COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

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LETTER APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO CBOE OPTIONS TRADING PLAN

The Commission today made public a letter of the Division of Market Regulation to the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Inc. informing the CBOE that the Commission did not disapprove amendments to the CBOE's plan to list and trade options. The amendments provide, among other things, for the establishment and operation of the Options Clearing Corporation as a common clearing entity for the clearing and settlement of options traded on the CBOE, the Amex, Inc. and such other options exchanges as in the future become participants in the Options Clearing Corporation. RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

AMENDMENTS ADOPTED RELATING TO DISCLOSURE OF RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN REGISTRANTS AND INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS

The Commission today adopted amendments to Form 8-K, Regulation S-X and the proxy rules which will require increased disclosure of relationships between registrants and their independent public accountants, particularly in cases where changes in accountants take place. The amendments adopted reflect several modifications to the amendments proposed in Securities Act Release No. 5534, dated October 11, 1974, but retain the basic thrust of those proposals. Briefly, the more significant adopted amendments are as follows:

- 1. Amendment of Item 12 of Form 8-K which requires disclosure of changes in accountant to: (a) include resignation (or declination to stand for reelection after completion of the current audit) and dismissal of accountants as reportable events as well as engagement of a new accountant; (b) include accountants for a significant subsidiary as well as principal accountants in the requirement; (c) require reporting of disagreements in connection with the audits of the two most recent fiscal years and any subsequent interim period preceeding the change rather than the eighteen months preceeding the change.
- Amendment of Regulation S-X to require footnote disclosure of reported disagreements and to require disclosure of transactions in the period in which the change in accountant occurs and similar transactions in the subsequent fiscal year if they are accounted for differently than the replaced accountant believed was required.
- 3. Amendment of Item 8 of Schedule 14A of the proxy rules to require, in connection with the annual meeting of security holders or where financial statements are included in the proxy statement, disclosure of: (a) the name of the principal accountant selected or recommended for the current year and the name of the accountant for the most recently completed fiscal year, is different; (b) disclosure of any disagreements reported on Form 8-K in connection with a change in auditors during the year, and a statement by the replaced auditor if he believes the description is incorrect or incomplete; (c) disclosure of whether the principal accountants for the current year and the most recently completed fiscal year

are expected to be present at the stockholder's meeting with the opportunity to make a statement and to respond to appropriate questions; (d) disclosure of the existence or lack of an audit committee of the board and the membership thereof it such a committee exists.

The amendments to Form 8-K and to Regulation 14A shall be effective for Forms 8-K and proxy statements filed subsequent to January 31, 1975. The amendment of Regulation S-X shall be effective with respect to financial statements filed for periods beginning on or after January 1, 1975. (ASR-165)

TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN FOUR COMPANIES

Exchange and over-the-counter trading has been suspended for a ten-day period beginning on December 19 and terminating at midnight (EST) on December 28, 1974 of all securities of the following companies which have failed to file 10-K and 10-Q reports with the Commission. Data Lease Financial Corp., a Florida corporation of North Palm Beach, Florida (traded over-the-counter); Potter Instrument Company, Inc., a New York corporation (listed on the American and PBW stock exchanges, trading halted on the AMEX November 18, 1974); Stelber Industries, Inc., a New York corporation (listed on the AMEX, trading halted on the AMEX October 10, 1974); and Disposable Research Industries, a California Company of Sun Valley, California (traded over-the-counter).

The Commission initiated the suspensions because the companies failed to comply with the reporting provisions of the Exchange Act resulting in the lack of current and accurate information available to the public. (Rel. 34-11145)

ADDITIONAL ACTION ON TWO TRADING SUSPENSIONS

The SEC has announced the suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of (a) Bio-Medical Sciences, Inc. for the further ten-day period December 20 - 29, inclusive; and (b) Continental Vending Machine Corp. for the further ten-day period, December 21 - 30, inclusive.

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

AMERICAN NATURAL GAS COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 13 to request a hearing on proposals of American Natural Gas Company, a registered holding company, and American Natural Gas Service Company, its wholly-owned subsidiary service company, whereby (1) Service Company will alter the formula for billing associated companies for services rendered, and (2) Service will issue and American Natural purchase up to \$1,500,000 of unsecured notes. (Rel. 35-18719 - Dec. 18)

MICHIGAN WISCONSIN PIPELINE COMPANY

The SEC has authorized proposals filed by Michigan Wisconsin Pipeline Company, (Mich-Wisc), a subsidiary of American Natural Gas Company, (American), a registered holding company, and American Natural Gas Offshore Company, (American Offshore), a newly created wholly-owned subsidiary of Mich-Wisc, whereby Mich-Wisc will purchase through December 31, 1975 up to \$1 million of the common stock of American Offshore. American Offshore has entered into a partnership agreement with a subsidiary of Texas Gas Transmission Corporation for the purpose of constructing a natural gas pipeline offshore Louisiana and Texas. ALABAMA POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued releasing jurisdiction reserved by the Commission in an order issued November 11, 1974 (Release 35-18670) regarding the sale of pollution control revenue bonds by an agency of the City of Mobile, Alabama, and the construction by or on behalf of said city agency of pollution control facilities for Alabama Power Company, a subsidiary of The Southern Company. The Commission had retained jurisdiction over Alabama's semi-annual installment payment obligations to the agency insofar as such payments are affected by the effective interest rate of said pollution bonds. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

HARTFORD VARIABLE ANNUITY LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

An order has been issued on an application of Hartford Variable Annuity Life Insurance Company, Hartford Variable Annuity Life Insurance Company Separate Account and Hartford Equity Sales Company, Inc., all of Hartford, Connecticut, exempting from the provisions of Section 22(d) and 27(a)(3) of the Act the proposed restructuring of sales and administrative charges imposed in connection with the sale of variable annuity contracts. (Rel. IC-8620 - Dec. 19)

SECURITY EQUITY FUND

An order has been issued on an application of Security Equity Fund, Inc., Security Investment Fund, Inc. and Security Ultra Fund, Inc. (collectively the Funds), registered open-end diversified management investment companies, and Security Distributors, Inc. (Distributors), the Funds' principal underwriter (Applicants), permitting the Funds to offer to exchange their shares for shares of Security Bond Fund, Inc. (Bond Fund) that were purchased pursuant to a lower sales load schedule than the schedule that is applicable to the other Funds, on the basis of relative net asset value per share plus an amount equal to the difference between the sales charge described in the prospectus of the Fund whose shares are being acquired and the sales charge that was paid on the Bond Fund Shares being exchanged.
