CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COLIN E. TONGS PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on January 16 Judge Stanley S. Harris for the District of Columbia entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Colin E. Tongs. The injunction, which was entered with Tongs'consent, restrains Tongs from future violations of Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act and related Rule 10b-5. The Commission's Complaint, filed on January 11, alleged that Colin E. Tongs, president of Transworld Network Corporation, violated and aided and abetted violations of Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and related Rule 10b-5. Tongs reviewed, signed and authorized the filing of Transworld's false and misleading periodic reports with the Commission, as well as co-authored other false and misleading documents, including a press release and brochures, which were disseminated to investors primarily located in Europe.

Tongs' actions were part of a fraudulent scheme involving undisclosed principals of Transworld and numerous other issuers. At the center of this scheme were Carl Porto and Charles Scheuerman, who were permanently enjoined in the previous Commission action, SEC v. Carl Porto, et al., 88 C 0239 N.D. III. (See LR-11785). (SEC v. Colin E. Tongs, USDC District of Columbia, Civil Action No. 90-0077) (LR-12361)

RICHARD DUTRISAC, OTHERS PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia, on January 31, permanently enjoined Richard Dutrisac, John E. McCullough, Sr. and John E. McCullough, Jr., from violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act. In its complaint, the Commission alleged that Dutrisac, then a director of Pancretec, Inc., obtained material nonpublic information concerning Abbott Laboratories' possible acquisition of Pancretec and conveyed that information to his friend/business associate McCullough, Sr., and that McCullough, Sr., conveyed the information to his son, McCullough, Jr., a registered representative. The Complaint further alleges that McCullough, Sr., purchased stock for himself and that McCullough, Jr., recommended the purchase of Pancretec stock to a number of clients.

The defendants consented to the orders without admitting or denying the Complaint's allegations. The Orders also require disgorgement by McCullough Sr., of \$17,125, by McCullough, Jr. of \$13,884.15 of which all but \$822.15 is waived due to his inability to pay, and requiring the payment of civil penalties by Dutrisac of \$13,500; McCullough, Sr., of \$17,125; and McCullough, Jr., of \$13,884.15 of which all but \$4,177.85 is waived due to McCullough, Jr.'s inability to pay. (SEC v. Richard Dutrisac, John E. McCullough, Sr. and John E. McCullough, Jr., U.S.D.C. D.D.C., Civil Action No. 90-0216 (TFH). (LR-12362).

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

RICHARD J. BURNS GUILTY OF MAIL FRAUD

The Boston Regional Office announced that on January 19 Richard J. Burns, 41, of 335 Allen Street, Springfield, MA., pleaded guilty in the U.S. District Court in Springfield to a one-count information charging him with mail fraud. The information alleges that Burns, a mathematics teacher, used the mails to conduct a "Ponzi Scheme" that defrauded approximately 30 investors who invested their money in a series of investment partnerships. The investment partnerships were called Life's Options, and sought to make profits by buying and selling index options.

Burns misrepresented the financial profitability of the partnerships in periodic financial reports that he prepared and mailed to investors. As a consequence of his misrepresentations, approximately 30 people invested in the unprofitable Life's Options partnerships, and lost over \$161,000. Burns faces a maximum penalty of five years imprisonment and a \$250,000 fine. Chief Judge Frank H. Freedman has scheduled sentencing for March 16, 1990. The initial investigation of this matter was conducted by the SEC, and subsequently referred to and prosecuted by the office of the U.S. Attorney in Springfield. (U.S. v. Richard J. Burns, USDC, D. Mass., Criminal No. 90-3002-F) (LR-12358)

PENNY STOCK PROMOTER PLEADS GUILTY

The Atlanta Regional Office and the Miami Branch Office announced that on December 14, 1989 Carl W. Martin of Mapleton, Utah, a self-employed penny stock promoter, pleaded guilty to two felony charges of violations of Sections 5(a) and 17(a) of the Securities Act in the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Florida. The information alleged that Martin knowingly engaged in a scheme to defraud the investing public by promoting the common stock of Goldcor, Inc. while failing to disclose his controlling interest in Goldcor, his sales of Goldcor stock through at least twenty brokerage accounts at eleven broker-dealers, his 1979 felony conviction for federal income tax violations and his 1975 bar by the Commission from association with any registered broker-dealer.

Martin pleaded pursuant to a plea agreement with the U.S. Attorney's Office entered into December 1, 1989, wherein Martin agreed to plead guilty to these felony violations and agreed to cooperate with the SEC in its continuing investigation. Martin faces a maximum of ten years in federal prison and \$20,000 in fines. (U.S. v. Carl W. Martin, Case No. 89-299-Cr-Orl-19, M.D. Fla.) (LR-12360)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

GOVAARS INVESTMENT TRUST

An order has been issued on an application filed by Govaars Investment Trust under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act, declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-17325 - Jan. 30)

FREEDOM INVESTMENT TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until February 26 to request a hearing on an application by Freedom Investment Trust, Freedom Investment Trust II and Freedom Investment Trust III for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act, amending existing orders of the Commission to permit certain additional waivers of a contingent deferred sales load. (Rel. IC-17326 - Jan. 30)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission has approved proposed rule changes under Rule 19b-4 by: <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> (SR-NASD-89-57) to require that the issuer of each security designated for inclusion in the NASDAQ/National Market System pay an annual participation fee of \$2,000 in addition to the annual fee specified in Schedule D of the NASD By-Laws (Rel. 34-27640); and <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> (SR-Phlx-89-53) to establish staffing requirements on the Phlx options floor on expiration Saturdays (Rel. 34-27650)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The New York Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change (SR-NYSE-90-02) under Rule 19b-4 to increase the threshold for reporting certain awards or claims under Rule 351 from \$5,000 to \$15,000 for individuals and from \$5,000 to \$25,000 for member organizations. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of January 29. (Rel. 34-27651)
