REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY AGENDA

The Commission is publishing, under the Regulatory Flexibility Act, an agenda of open and anticipated rulemaking actions and a list of rulemaking actions and reviews completed since the publication of the October 1989 agenda. The agenda, including the text of the individual entries, will be published in the Federal Register by April 30, 1990 as part of a government-wide Unified Agenda of Federal Regulations. Only the preamble of the Commission's regulatory agenda is available at this time.

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

FRIEND-OF-COURT BRIEF

The General Counsel announced that the Commission filed a friend-of-the-court brief in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia supporting the Securities and Investments Board of the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland in European American Corporation v. Securities and Investments Board (SIB), Civil Action No. 89-2333(JGP). The SIB argues it is immune to suit in the U.S. Government and is entitled to sovereign immunity under the Foreign Sovereign Immunities Act. The Commission supported the SIB's argument, citing the SIB's authority to promulgate rules and regulations for investment businesses in the United Kingdom and to investigate, discipline, and initiate civil and criminal actions in the U.S. to enforce U.K. laws.

SUPPLEMENTAL FRIEND-OF-THE-COURT BRIEF

Daniel L. Goelzer, the General Counsel of the Securities and Exchange Commission, announced that the Commission has filed in the U.S. District Court for the District of New Jersey, a supplemental friend-of-the-court brief in Elysian Federal Savings Bank v. First Interregional Equity Corporation, et al. In that case, Elysian seeks summary judgment on its allegation that the defendants charged undisclosed excessive mark-ups in transactions involving collateralized mortgage obligations (CMOs) and principal only trust certificates (POs). The supplemental brief, the second one filed by the Commission at the Court's request, discusses the appropriate principles for determining scienter in a fraud action alleging undisclosed excessive mark-ups, and argues that the CMOs and POs qualify as notes, for purposes of the federal securities laws, under the analysis employed recently by the Supreme Court in Reves v. Ernst & Young, NO 88-1480 (S.Ct. Feb. 21, 1990). The supplemental brief also concludes, based on new evidence added to the record, that the mark-ups on the CMOs were excessive. (Press Rel. 90-18)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

WILLIAM H. BARTLETT PLEADS GUILTY

The Chicago Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney for the Western District of Michigan announced that, on February 21, William H. Bartlett pled guilty to one count of mail fraud in connection with the sale of interests in a dairy cattle leasing program. On March 19, Rick E. Myers, a co-defendant, after a ten-day jury trial, was found guilty of fourteen counts of mail fraud. Sentencing is scheduled for Bartlett on April 13, 1990 and for Myers on May 7, 1990. The plea and verdict against Bartlett and Myers, respectively, stem from a scheme in which they raised approximately \$9 million from more than 200 investors residing in 23 states.

Previously, the Chicago Regional Office obtained orders of permanent injunction and disgorgement against Bartlett, Myers and their affiliated companies. An administrative proceedings is currently pending against Myers which has been continued until the conclusion of the criminal case. (LR-12434)
