COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

OTC BULLETIN BOARD DISPLAY SERVICE

The Secretary of the Commission sent a letter to Frank J. Wilson, Esq., Executive Vice President and General Counsel, National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc., which granted exemptions from Rule 15c2-11 under the Securities Exchange Act with respect to the gathering and furnishing of prescribed information by participating broker-dealers in connection with the publication or submission of quotations for certain securities during the first 60 days of operations of the OTC Bulletin Board Display Service.

TRADING SUSPENSIONS

The Commission announced the single ten day suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of Astro Enterprises, Inc. for the period beginning at 9:15 a.m. (EDT) on May 4, 1990, and terminating at 11:59 p.m. (EDT) on May 13, 1990. The Commission suspended trading in the securities of Astro in view of questions that have been raised about the accuracy and adequacy of Astro's financial statements and other disclosures, developments in the market for Astro's securities and sales of securities in the U.S. by Astro's shareholders. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

SSF, INC, JAMES A. LAIACONA ENJOINED

The Denver Regional office announced that, on April 13, Judge Lewis T. Babcock of the U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado entered final judgments of permanent injunction by default against SSF, Inc. and James A. Laiacona from future violations of the antifraud and reporting provisions of the Securities Act and the Securities Exchange Act. The complaint was filed on September 29, 1989.

The complaint alleged, among other things, that SSF and Laiacona had caused the company to utilize a registration statement that failed to reflect that Laiacona had gained control of the company or that he was subject to a Federal Court injunction for past securities violations. The complaint also alleged that SSF failed to file required periodic reports with the Commission. The civil action is continuing against Tracey Etelson Laiacona, SSF's former president and a director of the company. [SEC v. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

TOM W. SMITH INDICTED; JAMES R. BRUNDIGE, JR., RUSSELL T. POOLE ENTER PLEAS

The Commission and the U.S. Attorney in Charleston, West Virginia, announced that, on April 5, Tom W. Smith (Smith) of Phoenix, Arizona, was indicted for conspiracy to violate the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws as well as federal income tax law and for federal income tax fraud in connection with his allegedly improper diversion of investor monies from Vista Oil and Gas Corporation (Vista) of Parkersburg, West Virginia. James R. Brundige, Jr. (Brundige) of Parkersburg, West Virginia, and Russell T. Poole (Poole) of Phoenix, Arizona, were named as unindicted conspirators with Smith and were also charged in separate criminal informations with filing false federal income tax returns in connection with funds they received from Vista. The indictment alleges that Smith, Brundige and Poole conspired to use investor monies to pay for their personal expenses, contrary to representations which had been made to investors.

Smith, Brundige and Poole were previously enjoined, by consent, from violations of securities registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws in connection with their alleged diversion of \$2.8 million in secret profits from

investors' monies obtained by Vista to drill certain oil and gas wells. [United States v. Tom W. Smith, USDC SD West Virginia, Criminal No. A90-00065] (LR-12463)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Eastern Utilities Associates (EUA) and its wholly-owned public utility subsidiary company, EUA Power Corporation (EUA Power), whereby: (1) EUA will make, through May 15, 1991, up to \$75 million aggregate principal amount of capital contributions, open account advances an/or short term loans to EUA Power; (2) EUA Power will issue up to \$47 million of short-term notes to banks (Notes) to be issued or renewed though May 15, 1991; (3) EUA will guaranty the Notes; (4) EUA Power will issue and sell to EUA at \$100 per share up to 92,000 authorized and unissued shares of EUA Power's Class A Preferred Stock through the earlier of June 1, 1990 or commercial operation of the Seabrook Nuclear Power Project; (5) EUA will unconditionally guaranty up to \$10 million of EUA Power's obligations under a Decommissioning Costs Security Agreement; (6) EUA will issue up to \$75 million of short-term notes which may be issued or renewed through May 15, 1991, to evidence borrowings under its existing lines of credit; and (7) EUA Power will acquire and retire certain of its outstanding Series B Notes, Series C Notes, and/or Contingent Interest Certificates. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule change was filed by the <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> (SR-NASD-90-24), which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act, that reduces the services charges for the Computer Assisted Execution Service (CAES) from \$.01 to \$.005 per share. (Rel. 34-27948)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF OPTIONS PRICE REPORTING AUTHORITY AMENDMENT

An amendment was filed by the Options Price Reporting Authority to the Plan for Reporting of Consolidated Options Last Sale Reports and Quotation Information, which became effective under Rule 11Aa3-2(c)(3). The amendment will provide a new, temporary surcharge of \$300 commencing May 1990, payable by those persons who have direct access to OPRA's processor if they obtain such access through OPRA's old 2-line service, instead of the new 4-line service. This charge will remain in effect, unless extended, through July 1990, at the end of which the 2-line service is schedule to be discontinued. (Rel. 34-27951)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission has approved proposed rule changes filed by: <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> (SR-NASD-90-14) to codify in Schedules D and G of the NASD By-Laws (pertaining to NASDAQ and listed securities, respectively) the requirement that trades be reported within 90 seconds after execution (Rel. 34-27950); <u>International Securities Clearing Corporation</u> (SR-ISCC-89-01) concerning ISCC's intention to act as a data communications vehicle for passing information about PORTAL transactions

among the NASD, the PORTAL depository organization, CEDEL, and the PORTAL account instruction system (Rel. 34-27959); and <u>Depository Trust Company</u> (SR-DTC-90-04) to establish procedures to enable DTC participants to use certain DTC services to settle transactions effected in the National Association of Securities Dealers' PORTAL trading system (Rel. 34-27958). (The PORTAL System is more fully described in Release 34-27956.)
