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RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

PRIVACY ACT, SPECIFIC EXEMPTIONS

The Commission has approved a rule change exempting a new system of records from certain provisions of the Privacy Act of 1974, 5 U.S.C. 552a, to the extent that the system contains investigatory material pertaining to the enforcement of criminal laws or compiled for law enforcement purposes. The system of records includes the investigative files of the Office of Inspector General of the Commission. (Rel. 33-6865; 34-27996; 35-25086; 39-2241; IC-17471; IA-1227; PA-13)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS SETTLED AGAINST GARY W. CHAMBERS

The Commission issued an Order Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions to administrative proceedings instituted under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act against Gary W. Chambers (Chambers). The Order finds that Chambers, the former Senior Vice President of Compliance and Operations at First Investment Securities, Inc. (FIS), failed to adequately supervise the sales practice of William E. Parodi, Sr. and Frederick W. Parodi, with a view to preventing their violations within the meaning of Section 15(b)(4)(E) of the Securities Exchange Act (See Rel. 34-27299). The Order finds that Chambers failed to ensure that FIS had adequate supervisory and compliance procedures and that Chambers failed to discharge certain required supervisory obligations, including the conduct of ongoing compliance reviews.

The Commission determined to accept Chambers' Offer of Settlement in which he neither admits nor denies the Commission's findings and agrees to be suspended for six months from associating, in a supervisory capacity, with any broker-dealer, investment company, investment adviser or municipal securities dealer, and to comply with certain undertakings. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

IRA MICHAEL PATTON PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Seattle Regional Office announced that, on April 25, the Honorable Bruce Jenkins, Chief Judge for the U.S. District Court, at Salt Lake City, entered a final judgment of permanent injunction and order for disgorgement, interest and penalty against Ira Michael Patton. Patton, who consented to the entry of the judgment without admitting

or denying the violations, was enjoined from future violations of Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5, and he was ordered to disgorge profits allegedly obtained in this insider trading case along with prejudgment interest of \$26,964, and to pay a penalty of \$23,990, for a total payment, to be paid over time, of \$50,964 plus postjudgment interest. The disgorgement and prejudgment interest sums are to be paid to a Special Agent who will distribute the sums, on a pro rata basis, to persons who sold common stock of Motor Fuels Corporation in brokerage transactions on September 9, 10 and 11, 1984. The Commission earlier obtained final judgments of permanent injunction concerning future violations of Section 10(b) and Rule 10b-5 against the two other defendants (Peter Berney and Whitney Lund) involving payment of disgorged profits and a penalty by the two defendants of \$125,000, with neither defendant admitting or denying the violations. All three defendants were also alleged to have issued a false and misleading press release concerning Motor Fuels [SEC v. Ira Michael Patton, Peter Berney, Whitney Lund, Civil Action Corporation. C87-0797J, CD Utah] (LR-12467)

ARNOLD J. SWENSON PERMANENTLY RESTRAINED AND ENJOINED

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that, on April 30, the U.S. District Court for the District of Utah granted the Commission's Motion for Summary Judgment, denying Arnold J. Swenson's Cross-Motion and permanently restraining and enjoining Swenson from violating certain antifraud provisions of the Securities Act and Securities Exchange Act.

The Court found that Swenson, a Salt Lake City resident, aided and abetted the false closing of a Faspaq, Inc. S-18 offering, which was false and misleading. Swenson was found to have engaged in non bona fide stock transactions designed to create the appearance that Faspaq had successfully completed its offering, when in fact the offering was closed, by obtaining nominee shareholders who paid nothing, or less than full value, for their shares. Swenson is the final defendant of nine to be enjoined in this action, which also involved a pre-arranged merger agreement and the subsequent filing of a false post-effective amendment. Swenson's co-defendants, seven individuals and the issuer, consented to permanent injunctions, without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the complaint, enjoining them from violating certain of the antifraud provisions.
