# COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

#### ORDER APPROVING PROPOSAL RE RULE 80A

The Commission today issued an order approving proposals submitted by the New York Stock Exchange (SR-NYSE-90-5 and SR-NYSE-90-11), pursuant to Section 19(b)(1) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 19b-4 thereunder, to modify NYSE Rule 80A regarding index arbitrage and trading in baskets of stocks through the Exchange Stock Portfolio (ESP) Service. The proposals require that orders entered when the Dow Jones Industrial Average moves 50 points or more be done under certain conditions. (Rel. 34-28282)

# CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

# COMPLAINT AGAINST WILLIAM KELSEY

The Chicago Office filed a complaint in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois against William Kelsey, the vice-president of Circle Express, Inc., a publicly-traded company registered with the Commission, seeking to permanently enjoin him from further violations of the antifraud, filing and books and records keeping provisions of the federal securities laws.

The Complaint alleges that from approximately January 1987 to March 1988, Kelsey, among others, made and caused Circle to make numerous misrepresentations and omissions of material fact in its periodic reports, 1987 registration statement and other public reports. Specifically, the Complaint alleges that Kelsey, among others, overstated, and caused Circle to overstate, its income and assets, understated, and caused Circle to understate, its liabilities and expenses, and failed, and caused Circle to fail, to disclose numerous related-party and other material transactions. A complaint was also filed in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Indiana against Circle and some of its other officers and directors. [SEC v. William T. Kelsey (N.D. # ACTION AGAINST ARKANSAS COMPANY AND PRINCIPALS

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that, on July 18, a complaint seeking a Temporary Restraining Order and Other Equitable Relief was filed against Union National Mortgage Co. (UNMC), Mark Brandon Hopkins (Hopkins), and Timothy Bryan Gibbons (Gibbons), all of Little Rock, Arkansas, in the U.S. District Court, Eastern Division of Arkansas, in Little Rock, Arkansas.

The complaint charges that defendants UNMC, Hopkins, and Gibbons conducted a "free-riding" scheme, in which they persuaded at least six regional broker-dealers to open accounts for UNMC and to purchase or sell millions of dollars of government securities for UNMC. It is further alleged that the defendants failed to pay for government securities bought and sold by UNMC causing various broker-dealers to lose at least \$182,000, and resulting in a profit to them of over \$62,000. The complaint seeks a freeze of the defendants' assets, temporary and permanent injunctions, and disgorgement of illegally obtained profits with prejudgment interest on such profits. [SEC v. #### COMPLAINT AGAINST CIRCLE EXPRESS

On July 16, the Chicago Regional Office filed a Complaint in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Indiana against Circle Express, Inc., a publicly-traded company registered with the Commission, Arthur Belford, its president, Merle Bright, its chief financial officer, and Bruce Kalem, its comptroller, to permanently enjoin them from further violations of the filing, books and records keeping and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws.

The Complaint alleges that, between approximately October of 1985 to March of 1988, the defendants made and caused Circle to make numerous misstatements and omissions of material facts in its registrations statements, periodic reports and other public disclosures. Specifically, the defendants overstated, and caused Circle to overstate, its income and assets, understated, and caused Circle to understate, its liabilities and expenses and failed, and caused Circle to fail, to disclose numerous related-party and other material transactions. The Complaint alleges that Belford, Bright and Kalem falsified Circle's internal books and records and that Bright and Kalem made and caused false statements to be made to Circle's auditors. A Complaint was also filed in the Northern District of Illinois naming William T. Kelsey, a former officer and director of Circle, as the defendant for similar conduct. [SEC v. Circle Express, et al. (Rels. IC-17612 - July 25; IC-17618 - July 26 and IC-17619 - July 26, respectively)

THE SUPERTRUST FOR CAPITAL MARKET, INC. SHARES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 22 to request a hearing on an application filed by Applicants seek an order: (a) pursuant to section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 granting exemptions from sections 4(2) and 22(d) of the Act, and rule 22c-1 thereunder; and (b) pursuant to sections 11(a) of 11(c) of the Act approving an offer of exchange. The requested relief would: (1) permit a unit investment trust to issue redeemable securities that are divisible into non-redeemable components; (2) permit secondary market transactions in such redeemable securities at negotiated prices; and (3) approve the exchange of shares of an openend management company for units of beneficial interest in a unit investment trust. # IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes filed by the following became immediately effective under Section 19b-4 of the Securities Exchange Act: National Association of Securities Dealers (SR-NASD-90-34) to change Article VII, VIII and IX of the NASD By-Laws by providing additional time for the District Nominating Committees to certify to the respective District Committees candidates nominated to serve on the Board, District Committees or District Nominating Committees (Rel. 34-28239); Pacific Stock Exchange (SR-PSE-90-27) to waive transaction fees and charges for index warrants on the Financial Times-Stock Exchange 100 Stock Index (Rel. 34-28243) and Options Clearing Corporation (SR-OCC-90-06) relating to a change of date for its Annual Meeting of Stockholders (Rel. 34-28252). Publication of the proposals is expected in the Federal Register during the weeks of July 23 and 30.

Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
