ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

LAWRENCE G. ZULIANI BARRED

The New York Regional Office announced that the Commission has simultaneously instituted and settled administrative proceedings against Lawrence G. Zuliani of Woodbridge, New Jersey, and upon his consent barred Zuliani from association with a broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser, or investment company. The Commission found that Zuliani had been permanently enjoined upon his consent from violating the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws in an action styled [SEC v. Frank R. Grillo, et al., Civil Action 89-1453 (D.N.J.)]. The Commission also found that Zuliani had failed reasonably to supervise one person subject to his supervision, with a view toward preventing his violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Zuliani neither admitted nor denied the finding that he failed to supervise the individual at Walter Capital Corp., a defunct broker-dealer which underwrote an initial public offering of Regional Funding Corp. common stock in 1984. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

MARY BUSHBAUM AND BRADLEY LENNON CONSENT TO PERMANENT INJUNCTIONS

The Commission announced on August 27 the filing of a Complaint in the U.S.District Court for the Southern District of Ohio against Mary Bushbaum (Bushbaum) and Bradley E. Lennon (Lennon), alleging the defendants violated Section 10(b) of the Securities and Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5. The Complaint alleges that Bushbaum learned of confidential information concerning a proposed acquisition of Philips Industries, Inc. (Philips) by Merrill Lynch Capital Partners, Inc., in the course of her employment as a secretary at Philips' headquarters office. According to the complaint, Bushbaum improperly disclosed the confidential information to Lennon, her long-time friend. The complaint further alleges that Bushbaum and Lennon purchased securities of Philips in Lennon's name in anticipation that the price would rise after the public announcement of the agreement. The complaint alleges that the defendants made illegal profits of \$20,366.16 by purchasing call option contracts for Philips common stock shortly before the September 25, 1989 public announcement of the proposed merger. Simultaneously with the filing of the action, Bushbaum and Lennon, without admitting or denying the allegations, consented to the entry of permanent injunctions against future violations. Each defendant also agreed to disgorge trading profits in the amount of \$10,183.08 plu's interest, and to pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$10,183.08. (Bushbaum's payment of the civil penalty in excess of \$5,000 was waived in view of her limited resources). [SEC v. Mary Bushbaum and Bradley E. Lennon, Civil Action No.C-3-90-297 (S.D. Ohio)] (LR-12594).

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

GREENBERG SENTENCED TO CRIMINAL CONTEMPT

The Chicago Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney's Office announced that, on August 22, Judge James B. Moran sentenced Christopher Greenberg to two years imprisonment and three years probation for mail fraud and criminal violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act and to a concurrent one year prison term for criminal contempt of the Court's previously issued TRO and Permanent Injunction. Greenberg pled guilty to all charges after a criminal contempt Application and criminal complaint were filed in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois.

Greenberg and co-defendant William Keller fraudulently sold the unregistered securities of GIB, Ltd. After the defendants were enjoined from their securities law violations, they sold securities in violation of the Court's previously issued orders. The defendants made material misrepresentations to investors concerning expected returns, risks and use of proceeds. Keller will be sentenced on September 6, 1990. [U.S., ex rel., SEC v. William H. Keller and Christopher B. Greenberg, (U.S.D.C., N.D. Ill., Action No. 89 C 1946, Filed November 3, 1989)] (LR-12596)

APPALACHIAN POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 17 to request a hearing on a proposal by Appalachian Power Company, an electric utility subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to effect the refunding of up to \$17.5 million of pollution control revenue bonds issued in connection with the financing of pollution control facilities. (Rel. 35-25135)

APPALACHIAN POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 17 to request a hearing on a proposal by Appalachian Power Company, an electric utility subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to effect the refunding of up to \$10 million of pollution control revenue bonds issued in connection with the financing of pollution control facilities. (Rel. 35-25135)

INDIANA MICHIGAN POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 17 to request a hearing on a proposal by Indiana Michigan Power Company, an electric utility subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to effect the refunding of up to \$40 million of pollution control revenue bonds issued in connection with the financing of pollution control facilities. (Rel. 35-25135)

COLUMBUS SOUTHERN POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 17 to request a hearing on a proposal by Columbus Southern Power Company, an electric utility subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to amend and restate its Articles of Incorporation and to extend the time in which to issue and sell up to \$175 million aggregate principal amount in any combination of its first mortgage bonds, secured medium-term notes or unsecured notes, and up to \$75 million of its preferred stock, from December 31, 1990 to June 30, 1991. (Rel. 35-25135)

CENTRAL VERMONT PUBLIC SERVICE CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 17 to request a hearing on a proposal by Central Vermont Public Service Corporation, a public-utility holding company exempt from registration under Section 3(a)(2) of the Act pursuant to Rule 2, to acquire all of the outstanding common stock of Allied Power & Light Company, a privately held New Jersey electric-utility company qualified to do business in Vermont. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>New York Stock Exchange</u> (SR-NYSE-90-33) filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 of the Securities Exchange Act to allow the Exchange to make available to securities information vendors and "self-vending" member organizations and other financial institutions a specified portion of the limit orders for securities included on the Display Books (Look-at-the-Book-Information). Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of August 27. (Rel. 34-28375)
