CIVIL FROCEEDINGS

INJUNCTIVE ACTION AGAINST RAJIV MEHTA AND JOHN HOXMEIER

The Denver Regional Office announced the filing of a complaint in the U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado on September 10 seeking permanent injunctions against Rajiv P. Mehta and John A. Hoxmeier of Fort Collins, Colorado. Mehta and Hoxmeier were the president and vice-president, respectively, of 3CI, Incorporated, formerly a Fort Collins computer software company.

The complaint alleges that Mehta and Hoxmeier violated the antifraud and reporting provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 by causing 3CI to prematurely recognize revenue or to recognize revenue on non-existent transactions. The fraudulently recorded revenue resulted in the inclusion of materially misleading financial statements in eleven of 3CI's periodic reports, and in a registration statement filed in connection with 3CI's March 1987 public offering. 3CI raised \$8,700,000 in the offering. Mehta and Hoxmeier also sold personally owned 3CI stock in this offering, for which they received proceeds of \$1,210,000 and \$340,000, respectively. In addition to the permanent injunctions, the complaint seeks disgorgement of the proceeds Mehta and Hoxmeier received from the sale of their stock. [SEC v. Rajiv P. Mehta and John A. ### CHARGES AGAINST MAXWELL HUFFMAN, JR. AND OTHERS

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced on September 10 the filing of a civil action in Dallas federal court against four individuals and 22 corporations, charging a "Ponzi" type fraud in the sale of \$6.7 million of promissory notes and other securities to 172 persons residing primarily in the Dallas-Fort Worth area. The Commission alleges that, from 1986 to the present, the defendants have misused and misappropriated investor funds and seeks appointment by the Court of a receiver to preserve remaining assets.

Among the defendants charged were Maxwell Huffman, Jr., James Henry, John Forsberg, and James Stewart, all Dallas-Fort Worth area residents, and Secured Finance Corporations and the Friendly Car Auto World, all headquartered in Plano, Texas. In addition to a receiver, the Commission seeks permanent injunctions and disgorgement of unlawful gains, including interest thereon, against all defendants. [SEC v. Maxwell C. Huffman, Jr., et al., U.S.D.C. NC/TX (Dallas Division), Civil Action No. 3-90-2036-H] (LR-12610)

### BELFORD PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that, on August 13, the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Indiana entered an Order of Permanent Injunction against Arthur L. Belford, the former president and Chief Executive officer of Circle Express, Inc., a publicly-held trucking company with securities registered with the Commission. The Order was entered pursuant to a consent and stipulation in which Belford neither admitted nor denied the allegations contained in the Commission's Complaint.

The Order enjoins Belford from directly violating the antifraud provisions, and aiding and abetting the filing and books and records-keeping provisions of the federal securities laws.

The Commission's Complaint filed on July 16, 1990, alleged that from approximately January of 1987 to July of 1988, Belford, among other things, overstated and caused Circle to overstate its earnings, income and assets, understated and caused Circle to understate its liabilities and expenses, and failed and caused Circle to fail to disclose numerous related-party transactions. ### **REDDINGTON INVESTMENTS SUED**

The Fort Worth Regional Office filed a civil injunctive action on August 31 in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Texas, El Paso Division, against Reddington Investments, Inc., Reddington Group, Inc., Reddington Securities, Inc. (Reddington Securities), Bradley A. Near and K. Alan Russell. The complaint charges each of the defendants with violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The complaint seeks permanent injunctions enjoining the defendants from further violations of the federal securities laws.

According to the complaint, the defendants were in the business of syndicating real estate limited partnerships which they marketed through Reddington Securities, an in-house broker-dealer. The complaint alleges that between October, 1984 and May, 1986, the defendants fraudulently sold an estimated \$26 million in limited partnership interests to 610 investors. Offering documents used to sell the interests falsely stated that funds invested would be used only for the specific limited partnership for which the funds were raised, when, instead, funds were commingled and used for other purposes. In this manner, more than \$6 million of the \$26 million raised during this period was misused. [SEC v. # CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

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### CHARLES H. HOWARD, III INDICTED

The Boston Regional Office announced that, on September 6, a Federal Grand Jury indicted a former Director and First Vice President of Thomson McKinnon Securities, Inc., Charles H. Howard, III (Howard), of Bedford, New Hampshire. Howard was charged with three counts of conspiracy to obstruct an SEC investigation, obstructing an SEC investigation and perjury in connection with the SEC's 1987 investigation of alleged insider trading in connection with the public announcement that Suffield Savings Bank of Suffield, CT, and Coastal Savings Bank of Portland, ME, planned to merge. If convicted of all charges in the Indictment, Howard faces a maximum penalty of 15 years in prison and a \$750,000 fine.

The case was investigated by the Boston Regional Office of the Securities and Exchange Commission, the Market Surveillance Unit of the National Association of Securities Dealers, the U.S. Postal Inspection Service and the Economic Crimes Division of the U.S. Attorney's office. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

FG SERIES, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 9 to request a hearing on an application filed by FG Series, Inc. for an order under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-17734 - September 10)

An order has been issued under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that Dreyfus Corporate Cash Trust has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-17735 - September 11)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

### GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES

An order has been issued authorizing General Public Utilities Corporation (GPU), a registered holding company, and its wholly owned subsidiary company, GPU Nuclear Corporation (GPU Nuclear), to provide radiological decontamination and asbestos removal services at the Idaho Falls Naval Reactor Facility and at the Knolls Atomic Power Laboratory. GPU Nuclear has been authorized to form and capitalize a new subsidiary (NewCo) to carry out these services and NewCo has been authorized to finance such activities through short term loans from banks or GPU not to exceed an aggregate of \$1 million outstanding at any one time, through December 31, 1992. (Rel. 35-25142)

### NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing a proposal by National Fuel Gas Company (National), a registered holding company, and its subsidiary, Enerop Corporation (Enerop), whereby Enerop will acquire 143,000 shares of common stock for \$357,500 and 39,500 shares of preferred stock for \$158,000 of Metscan, Inc. (Metscan), a nonassociate company which develops and markets certain gas meter reading technology. (Rel. 35-25143)

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### ENTERGY CORPORATION

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Entergy Corporation (Entergy), a registered holding company, and its subsidiary companies, Arkansas Power & Light Company, Louisiana Power & Light Company and System Energy Resources, Inc. (Operating Subsidiaries), and Entergy Operations, Inc. (EOI), whereby Entergy will enter into separate Guarantee Agreements with each of the Operating Subsidiaries to guarantee the financial ability of EOI to meet its various obligations under certain nuclear power plant Operating Agreements. (Rel. 35-25144)

### INDIANA MICHIGAN POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Indiana Michigan Power Company, an electric public-utility subsidiary company of American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to sell certain electric power and other assets to Wabash Valley Power Association, Inc. for \$1,370,075. (Rel. 35-25145)

### APPALACHIAN POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Appalachian Power Company (APCo), an electric public-utility subsidiary company of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to make an \$800,000 cash capital contribution to its wholly owned subsidiary, Central Appalachian Coal Company. (Rel. 35-25146)

### EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 1 to request a hearing on a proposal by Eastern Utilities Associates (EUA), a registered holding company, to issue and sell, or in the case of shares purchased on the open market, to purchase and sell, the 139,664 shares of common stock remaining of the 3.8 million shares previously authorized to be issued and sold through December 31, 1990, pursuant to EUA's Dividend Reinvestment and Common Share Purchase Plan (Plan), and to issue and sell up to an additional 1 million shares of common stock under the Plan, from time to time, through December 31, 1992, under an exception from competitive bidding.
