FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT RELEASES

ORDER AFFIRMING IN PART AND REVERSING IN PART FOIA OFFICER'S DETERMINATION

The General Counsel sent a letter to Douglas Ressman affirming in part and reversing in part the FOIA Officer's determination to deny access to certain information and granting and denying access to certain other information not considered by the FOIA Officer concerning Morgan Gladstone and Company, Inc. The General Counsel affirmed the FOIA Officer's decision to withhold certain information on the basis of Exemptions 5 and 7(A), 5 U.S.C. 552(b)(5) and 7(A). The General Counsel reversed the FOIA Officer's decision to withhold other documents on the basis of Exemption 7(A). As to certain information not considered by the FOIA Officer, the General Counsel denied access to certain information under Exemptions 2 and 5, and granted access to other The General Counsel exercised his discretion to release certain information. documents exempt from disclosure pursuant to Exemption 2. The General Counsel also determined that certain material would be deleted from the documents to be released pursuant to Exemptions 6 and 7(C). Finally, the General Counsel indicated that certain additional responsive documents may exist. (FOIA Rel. 165)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

FINAL CONSENT JUDGMENT RE JOHN PETIT

On November 5, the New York Regional Office announced that John L. Petit (Petit), of Boca Raton, Florida, without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint, consented to the entry of a permanent injunction in the Federal District Court in New York. Petit agreed to be permanently enjoined from violating the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and to pay \$195,528.83 representing disgorgement of \$66,555.73 in illegal <u>BusinessWeek</u> trading profits, in brokerage commissions on his customers' <u>BusinessWeek</u> trades, in prejudgment interest, and a \$93,847.38 ITSA penalty. The Commission's complaint alleges that Petit traded securities of 42 companies while in possession of material, non-public information from pre-release editions of <u>BusinessWeek</u> that Petit obtained by paying hundreds of dollars each week to an employee of a firm that prints the magazine. The complaint further alleges that Petit passed the non-public information to a brokerage customer and a friend who both traded <u>BusinessWeek</u> securities.

As part of the agreement, Petit consented to the institution and settlement of an administrative proceeding barring him from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser or investment company. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

INDIANA MICHIGAN POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Indiana Michigan Power Company, an electric public-utility subsidiary company of American Electric Power Company, Inc., a registered holding company, to issue and sell from time to time through December 31, 1991 up to \$80 million aggregate principal amount of unsecured promissory notes (Notes) pursuant to a term loan agreement under an exception from competitive bidding. The proceeds of the Notes will be used to pay unsecured short-term indebtedness. (Rel. 35-25184)

ALLEGHENY GENERATING COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Allegheny Generating Company, a subsidiary of Allegheny Power System, a registered holding company, to extend until December 31, 1992 the time in which it may issue and sell its medium-term notes in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$150 million. GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 26, 1990 to request a hearing on a proposal by General Public Utilities Corporation (GPU), a registered holding company, and its wholly-owned subsidiary, General Portfolios Corporation (GPC), whereby GPU will make a cash capital contribution of \$10 million on or before December 31, 1990 to GPC. GPC in turn would purchase from California Energy Company, Inc. (CE) of \$10 million aggregate principal amount of 9.9% convertible subordinated debentures due 2005 to be issued by CE. AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 26, 1990 to request a hearing on a proposal by American Electric Power Company, Inc. (AEP), a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries, Appalachian Power Company, Columbus Southern Power Company, Indiana Michigan Power Company, Kentucky Power Company and Ohio Power Company to, through December 31, 1993, issue short-term notes to banks and issue and sell commercial paper to dealers in commercial paper, under an exception from competitive bidding. In addition, AEP Generating Company, Kanawha Valley Power Company, Kingsport Power Company, Michigan Power Company and Wheeling Power Company, also subsidiaries of AEP, propose to issue short-term notes to banks, through December 31, 1993. AEP requests authority to make cash capital contributions to certain of its subsidiaries through December 31, 1993. (Rel. 35-25186)

AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 26, 1990 to request a hearing on a proposal by American Electric Power Company (AEP), Inc., a registered holding company, and its subsidiary, American Electric Power Service Corporation (Service), whereby AEP will guarantee the payment of benefits by Service to the beneficiaries of Service's unfunded Excess Benefits Plan and other deferred compensation and employment agreements. PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> (SR-NASD-90-57) filed for immediate effectiveness of a proposed rule change that would amend Part IX of Schedule D of the NASD By-Laws which would add a service charge for the risk assessment function of the Automated Confirmation Transaction service of \$.02/side and \$15/month per correspondent firm. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of November 12. (Rel. 34-28595)

Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
