TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN CHAPARRAL MINING CORPORATION SECURITIES

The Commission announced the temporary suspension of trading in the securities of Chaparral Mining Corporation, a Colorado corporation with executive offices in Austin, Texas, for ten business days which began at 9:30 a.m. (EST) on December 24, 1990, and will terminate at 11:59 p.m. (EST) on January 8, 1991.

The Commission temporarily suspended trading in the company's securities because of questions raised about the adequacy and accuracy of publicly disseminated information concerning, among other things, the valuation of the company's assets, the results of the company's business operations, the company's business prospects, and the identities and backgrounds of control persons.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT RE LATIN INVESTMENT CORPORATION AND OTHERS

On December 21, the Commission announced that it filed a Complaint in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Latin Investment Corporation (LIC), Fernando Leonzo (Leonzo), Leonel Salinas (Salinas), and Jose A. Cortes (Cortes), alleging that the defendants violated Sections 5 and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The Commission is seeking a temporary restraining order and an order freezing the assets of Defendants Leonzo, Salinas, and Cortes. The Commission alleges that, from 1982 to the present, the defendants have been engaged in offering and selling unregistered securities in the form of "pass books" and that LIC, through misrepresentation, induced 3500 Latin American immigrants to invest \$6.8 million. The Complaint also alleges, among other things, that the Defendants used investors' funds for their personal benefit without disclosing that fact to investors. [SEC v. COMPLAINT RE BANK OF NEW ENGLAND CORPORATION

On December 21, the Commission announced the filing of a Complaint in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Bank of New England Corporation. The Complaint alleges that BNE violated Sections 10(b), 13(a), and 13(b)(2)(A) and

(B) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 10b-5, 12b-20, and 13a-13 thereunder in connection with the material understatement of BNE's allowance for loan and lease losses and related provision in BNE's third quarter 1989 Form 10-Q. The Complaint further alleges that BNE violated Section 17(a)(2) and (3) of the Securities Act of 1933 in connection with materially inaccurate disclosures regarding the impact of certain adverse trends on future operations in a September 1989 registration statement, and violated Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act and Rule 13a-13 thereunder in connection with similar materially inaccurate disclosures contained in BNE's second quarter 1989 Form 10-Q.

Without admitting or denying the allegations, BNE consented to the entry of a permanent injunction prohibiting BNE from violating the Exchange Act and the Securities Act. BNE also agreed to restate its third quarter 1989 financial statements; to have independent accountants conduct a SAS 30 review of its internal accounting controls and to adopt the resulting recommendations; and to have independent accountants review BNE's quarterly financial statements pursuant to SAS 36 for two years.
