Emu Farming in the United States is only about ten years old and the American emu farmer has struggled to make it a viable agriculture enterprise. During this process, many were unable to stand the financial losses and have gone bankrupt. Australian emu oil is already impacting the pricing structure by selling oil for about half of what it costs to produce. Now is NOT the time to break the back of our fledgling industry by allowing cheap, foreign products to reap the benefits of the hard work of the American emu farmer.

We are small hands-on farmers, not huge farming entities and it is our livelihood that is being threatened. I ask on behalf of all our farmers, many who have become friends, to reject this action.
