After reading Leda Hartman's appraisal on China's poultry export to U.S., I am very surprised: This guy knows nothing about China.

These years, U.S. has exported a great deal of poultry products to China, but only permits China to export so tiny quantity of cooked poultry products to U.S., I wonder who's benefits are hurt, Chinese peasants or American farmers?
