CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND

COMPLAINT NAMES OSR CORPORATION

The Commission announced that on April 29 it filed a civil injunctive action in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against OSR Corporation of Old Bethpage, New York. The Commission, in its complaint, alleged violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and sought a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief.

The Commission alleged that OSR, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended December 31, 1982, required to have been filed with the Commission by March 31, 1983, failed to file Notifications of Late Filing on Form 12b-25 and filed late various periodic reports. The Commission requested that the Court order OSR to file its delinquent annual report and enjoin it from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. OSR Corporation, U.S.D.C. D.C., Civil Action No. 83-1246). (LR-9986)

MUNDELEIN INTERNATIONAL, REPUBLIC FUNDING CO. ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on April 22 the Honorable George N. Leighton, Judge of the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Mundelein International, Inc., an Illinois corporation, after finding the defendant to be in default, having neither appeared or plead in the matter. Mundelein International was enjoined from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions. In addition, on April 1, Judge Leighton entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Republic Funding Corporation, also an Illinois corporation, prohibiting it from the triolations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Republic consented to the entry of the Final Judgment without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint.

The complaint for injunctive relief, which was filed on October 1, 1982, alleged in part, that Mundelein International, Republic and Clyde R. Johnson, in the offer, purchase and sale of certain securities, made untrue statements and omitted to state material facts to certain members of the public concerning, but not limited to, the return on the investment, the business history of the defendants, the existence of a previous Commission injunction entered against Johnson in 1977 and the existence of a bankruptcy petition which was filed by one of the issuers.

Judge Leighton's action on April 22 concluded this civil matter as to all three defendants. On February 25, Johnson consented to the entry of a final judgment of permanent injunction against him. On that same date Johnson was sentenced to a two-year suspended sentence, four years probation and six months of work release as a result of his guilty plea to the charge of criminal contempt for his violation of a previous injunction entered against him in 1977. WORLD OF TECHNOLOGY, INC.
