ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

S. PAUL PALMER CITED

Public administrative proceedings have been ordered under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against S. Paul Palmer of Danbury, Connecticut. The Order for Proceedings alleges that Palmer wilfully violated the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act and the Exchange Act in the offer and sale of the common stock of Commodity Management Systems International, S. A. (CMSI), a now dissolved Panamanian corporation that was located in the Bahamas.

Specifically, the Order alleges that during the period from in or about July 1979 to in or about January 1981, Palmer offered and sold such securities without having a registration statement filed or in effect and without an exemption from registration being available and induced public investors to purchase such securities by fraudulent acts including, among other things, organizing and operating CMSI as a pooled trading account in contravention of his employer's instructions, concealing his involvement in CMSI from his employer and investors; and omitting to tell investors the risks involved.

A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against Palmer are true and, if so, to decide what, if any, remedial action is necessary in the public interest. (Rel. 34-19835)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CROFF OIL COMPANY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on June 2 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Croff Oil Company of Denver, Colorado restraining and enjoining Croff from failing to file timely periodic reports and ordering it to comply with certain undertakings. The Commission, in its complaint which was filed on April 21, 1983, alleged that Croff, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file and file timely with the Commission certain annual and quarterly reports required to have been filed. Croff, consenting to the entry of the Court's judgment, admitted that it had filed reports in an untimely manner on 19 separate occasions and had failed to file Notifications of Late Filing on seven separate occasions. (SEC v. Croff Oil Company, U.S.D.C. D.C., Civil Action No. 83-1168). (LR-10020)
