## **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

### C. JOSEPH MANFREDO CITED

Public administrative proceedings have been instituted under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against C. Joseph Manfredo of Westport, Connecticut. The Order for Proceedings alleges that Manfredo wilfully violated the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act and the Exchange Act in the offer and sale of the common stock of Commodity Management Systems International, S.A. (CMSI), a now dissolved Panamanian corporation that was located in the Bahamas.

Simultaneously with the institution of the proceedings, the Commission accepted an Offer of Settlement submitted by Manfredo in which he consented to the entry of findings, and without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, consented to a suspension from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company, or municipal securities dealer, for a period of 12 months and an undertaking to file an affidavit of compliance with the Commission.

Specifically, the Commission made findings that during the period from in or about July 1979 to in or about January 1981, Manfredo offered and sold CMSI securities without having a registration statement filed or in effect as to said securities and induced public investors to purchase such securities by fraudulent acts including, among other things, organizing and operating CMSI as a pooled trading account in violation of his employer's directives, concealing his involvement in CMSI from his employer and investors, and omitting to tell investors the risks involved.

# **SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS**

### EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule change filed by The Options Clearing Corporation under Rule 19b-4 (SR-OCC-83-13) has become effective in accordance with Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposal amends several provisions of OCC's Interpretations and Policies under Rule 604(c) relating to OCC's guidelines for approving U.S. and non-U.S. institutions as issuers of letters of credit for OCC margin purposes. Under the revised guidelines: (1) foreign institutions may have a branch or agency anywhere in the United States; (2) no institution may issue letters of credit in an amount exceeding 15% of its equity to a single clearing member; and (3) foreign institutions meeting certain additional criteria may issue letters of credit. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of July 18. (Rel. 34-19954)

### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission has approved proposed rule changes filed by the following: The Options Clearing Corporation (SR-OCC-82-25) which will facilitate clearing member financing by permitting clearing members to pledge unexercised excess long market-maker or specialist equity option positions as collateral for loans from other clearing members or from banks. (Rel. 34-19956); and The American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-83-4) to amend Article VII, Section 1 of the Exchange Constitution to eliminate payment of an initiation fee for certain intra-firm transfers where a membership has been temporarily transferred from an active floor member to another person who is not active on the floor and then retransferred to an active floor member. (Rel. 34-19957)

The Philadelphia Depository Trust Company and The Stock Clearing Corporation of Philadelphia submitted to the Commission proposed rule changes under Rule 19b-4 (SR-Philadep-83-4, 83-5; SR-SCCP-83-5, 83-6) that would amend a number of Philadep and SCCP by-laws and rules either to update them or to conform them to certain Division of Market Regulation Standards for the Registration of Clearing Agencies that concern Sections 17A(b)(3)(A)-(I) of the Act. Publication of the submissions are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of July 25.

These proposed rule changes were previously published in the SEC News Digest on July 13, 1983 as Release Nos. 34-19954-57. Those releases were withdrawn under those release numbers, the release numbers were assigned to other matters, and the subject proposed rule changes have been assigned new release numbers as follows - Rel. 34-19995; 34-19997; 34-19998; and 34-19996).
