COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC HALTS TRADING IN DCI TELECOMMUNICATIONS, INC.

The Commission announced the temporary suspension pursuant to Section 12(k) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 the over-the-counter trading of securities of DCT Telecommunications, Inc. (DCI) of Stratford, Connecticut at 9:30 a.m. on May 3, 1999, and terminating at 11:59 p.m. on May 14, 1999. The Commission temporarily suspended trading in the securities of DCI because of questions that have been raised concerning the accuracy and adequacy of DCI's financial statements, specifically, DCI's apparent inflation of revenues by accounting for one or more business combinations as a pooling of interests. JAMES KELLY ASSUMES DUTIES AS ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE

On April 12, James Thomas Kelly assumed the duties of administrative law judge at the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. Previously, Judge Kelly served as an administrative law judge at the Social Security Administration and as Assistant General Counsel at the Commodity Futures Trading Commission.

Judge Kelly received his A.B. in economics, cum laude, from Georgetown University in 1969 and his J.D. from the University of Pennsylvania Law School in 1975.

REPORT ON ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS FOR THE PERIOD OCTOBER 1, 1998 THROUGH MARCH 31, 1999

A Report on Administrative Proceedings for the Period October 1, 1998, through March 31, 1999, has been issued giving summary statistical information on the Commission's administrative proceedings caseload. Reports are issued each October and April and are published in the SEC Docket and appear on the Commission's website. (Rel. 34-41352)

RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

BROKER-DEALER REGISTRATION AND REPORTING - FORM BD

The Securities and Exchange Commission is proposing technical amendments to Form BD, the uniform broker-dealer registration form, and related rules under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. proposed amendments would adapt Form BD to the new, Internet-based Central Registration Depository (CRD) system, known as "Web CRD." The CRD is operated and maintained by the National Association of Dealers, Inc. and is used by the Commission, Securities self-regulatory organizations, and state securities regulators to register and license broker-dealers and their registered personnel.

Web CRD is expected to further streamline the "one stop" registration process for broker-dealers and their associated persons. It is also expected to improve access by regulators and the public to specific registrant disciplinary and disclosure information. (Rel. 34-41351; File No. S7-16-99)

ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

RODD BUCKLE OF LAS VEGAS, NEVADA IS BARRED FROM PENNY STOCK OFFERINGS

The Commission issued an Order Instituting Public Proceedings Pursuant to Section 15(b)(6) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, Making Findings, and Imposing Remedial Sanctions (Order) against Rodd Buckle (Buckle) barring him from participating in an offering of penny stock. The Order is based upon the entry of a permanent injunction against him on April 22, 1999, arising out of the Commission's civil action against Buckle and other defendants and relief defendants. Buckle consented to the Order without admitting or denying the Commission's findings.

The Commission alleged in its complaint that Buckle participated in the sale of unregistered securities by Maven Capital Corporation and Maven Enterprises, Inc., which Buckle controlled, while making material misrepresentations as to the planned use of proceeds from those sales. The defendants fraudulently raised at least \$3 million. Buckle spent most of these proceeds to support his lavish lifestyle. (Rel. 34-41349; File No. 3-9885)

SUMMARY JUDGMENT GRANTED IN INTERNATIONAL TRADING SCHEME THAT DEFRAUDED OVER 1,400 INVESTORS

On April 23, after issuing his findings of fact and conclusions of law on March 22, Walter S. Smith, United States District Judge for the Western District of Texas, granted the Commission's motion for summary judgment and entered a Final Judgment against Scott L. Klion individually and doing business as Cen-Tex Alchemy Guild, and Elizabeth Alaniz. Judge Smith found, among other things, that offering materials, newsletters and account statements prepared by Klion and Alaniz, and used by them in the offer and sale of Cen-Tex securities, were rife with false, misleading or incomplete statements of material fact. He also found that a significant portion of the money the defendants raised from investors was spent on "Ponzi" payments to other investors, and for Klion's and Alaniz's personal expenses.

In its summary judgment motion, the Commission demonstrated that Klion and Alaniz were responsible for an international investment scheme that defrauded over 1,400 victims of nearly \$3 million. The Commission further established that the defendants falsely represented to investors that Cen-Tex would invest their money in currency trading programs, and other undisclosed investment activities, that would generate gross returns of 400% per annum (or more, in limited circumstances), and that investors would receive "safe, guaranteed" returns -- payable in monthly dividends, or allowed to accrue and compound -- ranging from 80% to 200% annually. In reality, the trading programs did not exist, and Klion and Alaniz used funds from current investors to pay purported monthly "dividends" to prior investors in an obvious "Ponzi" scheme, and for their own purposes.

The Final Judgment permanently enjoins Klion and Alaniz from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The Court also terminated Klion's and Alaniz's right, title or interest in any funds or properties held by the court-appointed receiver; ordered Klion and Alaniz, jointly and severally, to pay disgorgement in the amount of \$1,172, 759.21, plus prejudgment interest of \$119,815.21, and assessed a \$110,000 civil penalty against each defendant. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

BANKERS TRUST COMPANY, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 24 to request a hearing on an application filed by Bankers Trust Company, et al. for an order exempting applicants from Section 15(a) of the Investment Company Act. The order would permit the implementation, without prior shareholder approval, of new investment advisory and subadvisory agreements in connection with the merger of Bankers Trust Corporation and Deutsche Bank AG. The order would cover a period of up to 150 days following the later of the date the merger is consummated or the date the requested order is issued, but in no event later than November 30, 1999. EATON VANCE MANAGEMENT, ET AL.

An order has been issued on an application filed by Eaton Vance Management, et al. pursuant to Section 17(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 17d-1 under the Act. The order permits certain registered closed-end management investment companies to impose asset-based distribution fees. (Rel. IC-23818 - April 30)

MERRILL LYNCH LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY, ET AL.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 26(b) of the Investment Company Act to Merrill Lynch Life Insurance Company (Merrill Lynch Life), Merrill Lynch Life Variable Annuity Separate Account A (Annuity Account A), ML Life Insurance Company of New York (together with Merrill Lynch Life, Companies) and ML of New York Variable Annuity Separate Account A (together with Annuity Account A, Accounts) (all collectively, Applicants) approving the substitution of Units of the 1999 ML Select Ten V.I. Trust (1999 Portfolio) for Units of the 1998 ML Select Ten V.I. Trust (1998 Portfolio) of the Equity Investor Fund, Defined Asset Funds held by the Accounts to support certain policies issued by the Companies. An order has also been issued pursuant to Section 17(b) of the Act, granting an exemption from Section 17(a) to the extent necessary to permit Applicants to carry out the above-referenced substitution in whole or in part through an in-kind redemption and purchase. AMERICAN SKANDIA TRUST AND AMERICAN SKANDIA INVESTMENT SERVICES, INC.

An order has been issued on an application filed by American Skandia Trust, on behalf of its series AST Putnam Value Growth & Income Portfolio, AST Putnam International Equity Portfolio and AST Putnam Balanced Portfolio (Portfolios), and American Skandia Investment Services, Inc. under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting applicants from Section 15(a) of the Act. The order permits the implementation, without shareholder approval, of new investment sub-advisory agreements (Interim Agreements) following the resignation of the investment sub-adviser to the Portfolios. The order covers a period beginning on the date that the termination of the existing sub-advisory agreement becomes effective and continues for a period of up to 150 days (but in no event later than September 30, 1999) (Interim Period). The order also permits the payment of fees earned under the Interim Agreements during the Interim Period, following shareholder approval. (Rel. IC-23820 - April 30)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NORTHEAST UTILITIES

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Northeast Utilities (NU), a registered holding company, and its service company subsidiary, Northeast Utilities Service Company, for NU to distribute rights regarding its common stock under a stockholder rights plan. (Rel. 35-27013)

NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

An order has been issued authorizing New England Electric System (NEES), a registered holding company, to amend its trust agreement to allow the proposed merger of NEES and The National Grid Group plc, and to give its shareholders certain appraisal rights. (Rel. 35-27014)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-99-16) relating to Agency Quotations and access fees. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal</u> Register during the week of May 3. (Rel. 34-41343)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved a proposed rule change submitted by the New York Stock Exchange (SR-NYSE-99-04) amending NYSE Rule 347 to expressly allow employees to bring employment related claims before the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, National Labor Relations Board, or state or local anti-discrimination agencies. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of May 3. (Rel. 34-41344)

The Commission approved a proposed rule change and issued notice of filing and granted accelerated approval to Amendment No. 1 to a proposed rule change submitted by the <u>New York Stock Exchange</u> (SR-NYSE-99-02) for permanent approval of the pilot program relating to the listing eligibility criteria for closed-end investment companies registered under the Investment Company Act.
