ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST DOY L. DANIELS, JR.

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Doy L. Daniels, Jr. who, from January 1986 to July 1987, was a registered representative associated with an Illinois broker-dealer registered with the Commission. The Order was based upon a Final Judgment and Order of Permanent Injunction entered against Daniels on March 30, 1988 [SEC v. Doy L. Daniels, Jr., WDTN, Case No. 87-2575-GB]. Daniels was permanently enjoined from violating the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The Order was also based upon Daniels' criminal conviction on January 20, 1989 [U.S. v. Doy L. Daniels, Jr., WDTN, Crim. Action No. 88-20157T]. Daniels was convicted, upon a plea of guilty, to seven counts of securities fraud, six counts of mail fraud, and one count of bank fraud. A hearing will be held to determine if the staff's allegations are true and what action is appropriate. (Rel. 34-26798)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST KERRY A. HURTON, OTHERS

The Commission today filed a civil injunctive action in the U.S. District Court for the District of Massachusetts against Kerry A. Hurton, of Boston, Massachusetts; Sheldon M. Stone, of Marblehead, Massachusetts; Bruce E. Maurice, of Danvers, Massachusetts; Eric Laboz, of New York, New York; and Jonathan R. Beck, of North Hills, New York. The Complaint alleges violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 in connection with trading in the securities of Parisian, Inc. Specifically, it alleges that Hurton, while a paralegal assistant in the Boston law office of Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom, misappropriated material nonpublic information concerning a proposed takeover of Parisian and disclosed the misappropriated information, directly or indirectly, to the other defendants, who traded on it and/or tipped others who traded.

The Complaint seeks permanent injunctions and other equitable relief. (SEC v. Kerry A. Hurton, et al., USDC DMA, Civil Action No. 89-1070, JMc). (LR-12097)

COMPLAINT NAMES WILLIAM WOLSKI AND HENRY M. PORTER

The New York Regional Office filed its Complaint on May 10 in the Southern District of New York seeking permanent injunctive relief, disgorgement, and payment of a civil penalty, based upon allegations of insider trading, against William Wolski and Henry M. Porter.

The Complaint alleges that Porter is a partner in the law firm that is general counsel to Mark IV Industries, Inc. Porter is alleged to have misappropriated information from his firm and tipped his brother-in-law, Wolski, who traded in Gulton Industries, Inc. and LFE Corporation while in possession of material, nonpublic information that these companies were targets of possible takeovers by Mark IV. Porter also traded in LFE while in possession of this material, nonpublic information.

Without admitting or denying the Complaint's allegations, defendants consented to permanent injunctions prohibiting them from violating Sections 10(b) and 14(e) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 10b-5 and 14e-3. Both agreed to disgorge illegal trading profits and to pay a civil penalty under the Insider Trading Sanctions Act of 1984. Final Judgments have been submitted to the Court for approval. (SEC v. William Wolski and Henry M. Porter, 89 Civ. 3202, JES). (LR-12092)

JOHN F. TOALE AND CLIFFORD M. REITER ENJOINED

The San Francisco Branch Office announced that on May 1 the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California entered Orders of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief against John F. Toale, of New Jersey, and Clifford M. Reiter, of New York City, two of the remaining defendants in a case involving the syndication of oil and gas limited partnerships. The Orders permanently enjoin defendants from violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b), 13(a), 13(b)(2)(A), 13(b)(2)(B), 15(c)(3), 15(d), 17(a)(1), and 17(e)(1)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. In addition, Toale is permanently enjoined from violations of Rule 13b2-2 of the Exchange Act. Defendants consented to the Orders without admitting or denying the allegations in the Complaint. (SEC v. Morgan Petroleum, Inc., et al., USDC NDCA, Civil Action No. C 87-20628 WAI). (LR-12093)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SPIRIT OF AMERICA GOVERNMENT FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 5 to request a hearing on an application filed by Spirit of America Government Fund, Inc. for an order declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-16951 - May 11)

MERRILL LYNCH KECALP L.P. 1986

An order has been issued on an application filed by Merrill Lynch KECALP L.P. 1986 (1986 Partnership), Merrill Lynch KECALP L.P. 1987 (1987 Partnership), Merrill Lynch Interfunding Inc., and KECALP Inc. exempting from the provisions of Section 17(a) of

the Investment Company Act the acquisition by the 1986 Partnership of certain securities of Prince Holdings, Inc. and the acquisition by the 1987 Partnership of certain securities of John Alden Financial Corporation, in each case from an "affiliated person," as defined in the Act. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, INC.;
THE CONNECTICUT LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY

Notices have been issued giving interested persons until June 5 to request a hearing on a proposal by the following companies filed under Release 35-24888, dated May 11: AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, INC. (AEP) - a registered holding company, and a proposed subsidiary, AEP Resources, Inc., to engage in the investment and participation in qualifying cogeneration facilities and in qualifying small power production facilities. AEP and AEP Resources propose for AEP Resources to issue and AEP to acquire 100 shares of common stock of AEP Resources for \$10,000. AEP proposes to invest up to an aggregate amount of \$7.5 million in AEP Resources for each of the four years in the period ending December 31, 1992; and THE CONNECTICUT LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY - subsidiary of Northeast Utilities, to issue the proceeds from the issuance and sale, through December 31, 1989, of the remaining \$150 million of \$350 million principal amount of first and refunding mortgage Bonds to pay off its short-term debt. By order dated April 11, 1988 [Rel. 35-24622], CL&P was authorized to issue and sell up to \$350 million principal amount of Bonds, in one or more series, from time to time through December 31, 1989, and to use the net proceeds, in relevant part, to pay off an aggregate of up to \$200 million of short-term debt.

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Association of Securities Dealers filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NASD-88-52) that would add Section 44 to Article III of its Rules of Fair Practice to prevent a member firm that withdraws as a market maker in a NASDAQ security from continuing market making activity in that security in the over-the-counter market while the firm is ineligible to re-enter NASDAQ as a market maker. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of May 8. (Rel. 34-26794)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule change filed by the Participants Trust Company has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Act of 1934. The proposal (SR-PTC-89-1) modifies PTC's fee schedule. (Rel. 34-26799)
