COMMENTS REQUESTED ON PROPOSED RULE 52

The Commission is proposing for public comment Rule 52 under the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935. Proposed Rule 52 would exempt from specific Commission approval certain financings by public-utility subsidiary companies of registered public-utility holding companies as long as specified conditions are met. In addition, where the exempt securities are to be acquired by a parent holding company, a limited exemption would be available from the application requirements of Section 9(a) of the Act.

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

1988 LOST AND STOLEN SECURITIES PROGRAM STATISTICS AVAILABLE

The 1988 aggregate dollar value of certificates reported as lost, missing, stolen, or counterfeit under the Commission's Lost and Stolen Securities Program totalled \$2,877,883,729, a 4% increase over 1987. The data base, operated and maintained by the Securities Information Center, currently contains information on certificates with a reported value of approximately \$15.1 billion. There also was a decrease in the number of certificates inquired about that matched reports of lost, stolen, missing, or counterfeit securities, from 2,564 in 1987 to 2,178 in 1988. The dollar value of lost, missing, stolen, or counterfeit securities matched with inquiries through the Commission's Program in 1988 totalled \$10,679,142, an increase from the 1987 dollar value of \$9,230,307. FOIA APPEAL OF STEPHEN A. RAPHAEL

The General Counsel sent a letter to Dr. Stephen A. Raphael affirming in part and reversing in part the Freedom of Information Act Officer's determination to withhold information concerning New York City Shoes Corporation. The General Counsel determined that, while some of the information requested by Raphael should be released, the majority of the information may be withheld pursuant to FOIA Exemption 7(A), 5 USC 552(b)(7)(A), and the Commission's rule implementing that exemption, 17 CFR 200.80(b)(7). ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

SEA INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT, INC., OTHERS SANCTIONED

The Commission instituted administrative proceedings against Sea Investment Management, Inc., an Arizona-based investment adviser, Sea Investors Corporation, a broker-dealer also based in Arizona, and Christa U. Petracca, chief operating officer of both registrants. Simultaneously, the Commission made findings and imposed remedial sanctions pursuant to the Respondents' Offers of Settlement, wherein they neither admitted nor denied violations. The Commission found recordkeeping, reporting, share pricing, and custodial violations in the operation of three mutual funds managed by the investment adviser respondent, reporting violations by two other investment companies which were aided and abetted by Petracca, recordkeeping and reporting violations by the investment adviser respondent, and reporting violations by broker-dealer respondent. Each respondent was censured and required to comply with specified undertakings, including requirements for (1) investment company boards of directors with an audit committee and a majority of independent directors, and (2) periodic compliance reviews by an independent consultant. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES ROBERT C. DIGENARO

The Boston Regional Office filed a Complaint on May 9 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Connecticut against Robert C. DiGennaro, formerly President, Chairman, and Chief Executive Officer of Suffield Bank of Suffield, Connecticut. The Complaint alleges that, while in possession of material non-public information concerning a proposed merger between Suffield and Coastal Savings Bank of Portland, Maine, DiGennaro tipped several close friends and business associates who illegally profited from purchases in Coastal stock. DiGennaro, currently an inmate in Allenwood Prison Farm, consented to a permanent injunction against him without admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint. In a Stipulation and Consent filed along with the Complaint, DiGennaro consented to imposition of a \$249,078 civil penalty for his involvement in the insider trading scheme, provided however, that based upon DiGennaro's demonstrated financial inability to pay, payment of \$4,000 within a specified time period shall constitute full satisfaction of the proposed penalty judgment. INJUNCTION, ASSET FREEZE, AND OTHER EQUITABLE RELIEF ENTERED AGAINST WILLIAM S. HOGLUND

On May 16, U.S. District Court Judge Leonard B. Sand, Southern District of New York, issued a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction by Consent (Final Judgment) and an Order and Judgment Freezing Assets and Ordering Other Equitable Relief by Consent (Order and Judgment) against William S. Hogleund. The Final Judgment enjoins Hogleund from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The Order and Judgment requires him to submit an accounting and a plan of disgorgement to the Court and to the New York Regional Office.

The April 4 Complaint alleged that Hogleund, a registered broker-dealer, obtained approximately \$1,800,000 from investors for the purpose of executing various trading strategies in his market maker accounts on various securities exchanges. The Commission charged that Hogleund, contrary to his representations, accepted funds from investors, and then converted, dissipated, and secreted these funds for his own use, rather than investing them as promised. Furthermore, the Complaint alleged that Hogleund owes investors at least \$1,560,000. (SEC v. William S. Hogleund, USDC SDNY, Civil Action No. 89 Civ. 2222). (LR-12100)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE RODNEY SQUARE INTERNATIONAL SECURITIES FUND, INC.

An order has been issued exempting The Rodney Square International Securities Fund, Inc. (Fund), Wilmington Trust Company, and Edinburgh Fund Managers, plc, from Section 15(a) of the Investment Company Act to permit the Fund to compensate Edinburgh for its fees under an interim investment advisory agreement entered into without prior Fund shareholder approval. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PENNSYLVANIA ELECTRIC COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Pennsylvania Electric Company, subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, to issue and sell from time to time through December 31, 1989, up to an aggregate principal amount of \$100 million of first mortgage bonds and/or medium-term securities either as first mortgage bonds or unsecured notes in any combination thereof. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

TEMPORARY REGISTRATION OF A CLEARING AGENCY GRANTED

The Commission approved an application for registration as a clearing agency filed by the International Securities Clearing Corporation (ISCC) under Section 17A of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The order registers ISCC as a clearing agency on a temporary basis for 18 months and grants an exemption from the fair representation requirements of Section 17A(b)(3)(C) of the Act for that period of time. ISCC intends to enter into link agreements with non-U.S. clearing entities so that each may use the other's trade comparison, clearance, settlement, and custodial services to facilitate the clearance and settlement of international securities transactions. NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES
