DEA requests \$3,100,000 and 18 positions (including 11 special agents) to expand SOD, a comprehensive

enforcement approach designed specifically to combat the surrogates of major drug trafficking organizations operating within the United States and their command and control centers based throughout the world. This increase is exclusively for the Southwest Border and Financial Investigations. DEA will dedicate 9 positions (including 6 special agents) to assist in reducing the amount of drugs destined for the United States via the Southwest Border. This effort works to counter drug activity by enhancing DEA's ability to penetrate, disrupt, and dismantle major Mexican and Colombian drug trafficking organizations that are using the border to smuggle drugs into the United States. The other 9 positions (including 5 special agents and 2 intelligence analysts) will be dedicated to the establishment of a Money Laundering/Financial Investigations Unit within SOD. These resources will be used to provide nationwide oversight and coordination on Title III field investigations that identify and target money laundering operations.

An increase of \$33,000,000 and one position will support O&M, telecommunications and contract support staff for the global FIREBIRD network, and \$23,000,000 will be used to establish a sufficient technology renewal program to replace ADP hardware as it reaches the end of its life cycle.
