## **Program Description**

The PSOB Program's mission is to provide financial and emotional assistance to the eligible survivors of federal, state, and local public safety officers who have died as the result of traumatic injury or who are permanently and totally disabled as the direct result of a catastrophic injury sustained in the line of duty, and to provide educational assistance to the spouse and children of slain or totally disabled public safety officers.

## Program Improvements

The Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) has requested a lower level of funding for Discretionary Disability Benefits because funding in recent years has slightly exceeded the payments made to disability claimants. Based on the number of eligible claims closed in recent years and including the increased benefit amount to claimants, BJA expects that this lower funding level will be sufficient to fund fully all approved disability claims in 2003.
