FSIS Extends Comment Period on Term "Natural"

FSIS has extended the comment period on how to define the term "natural" until March 5.

FSIS held a public meeting on December 12, 2006 to discuss a petition to establish a definition for the voluntary claim "natural." The agency also gathered comments on conditions under which the claim should be allowed to be used on the labels of meat and poultry products.

The original comment period closed on January 11; however, FSIS has taken this action to respond to requests that were made at and after the December 12 meeting.

FSIS to Hold Regulatory Education Sessions for Small and Very Small Plants

FSIS Issues Supplemental Labeling Guidance and Additional Q & As for Notice 75-06

FSIS recently issued a supplemental labeling guidance and additional questions and answers (Q & As) pertaining to FSIS Notice 75-06, Verification Instructions for Changes in Label Requirements for Uncooked and Raw, Frozen, Breaded, Boneless Poultry Products.

The additional labeling guidance and Q & As are intended to provide industry with assistance in developing validation for label cooking instructions for raw and partially cooked, breaded, boneless poultry products as set forth in Notice 75-06 issued on November 13, 2006.
