How do I find quality health information on the Internet?

Authority, Accuracy, and Audience

- Look at the organization's mission and "about us" page.
- Look at the authorship and sponsorship of the site.
- Is the information provided appropriate to the audience level, well-organized and easy to use?

Availability, Maintained, and Up-to-date

- The Web site maintains its links and the links are not broken.
- The source for the contents of the Web page(s) and the entity responsible for maintaining the Web site (webmaster, organization, creator of the content) is clear.
- Information is current or an update date is included.
- Registration is not required to view the information on the site.

Special features

The site provides unique information to the topic with a minimum of redundancy and overlap between resources.

A clinical trial is a research study in human volunteers to answer specific health questions. You can search clinical trials by condition, location, age, trial phase, and sponsor.
