Eleven occupations had 20,000 or more injuries and illnesses with days away from work in 2005, making up 35.9 percent of all injuries and illnesses.

The three occupations in the transportation and material-moving occupations (laborers and material movers; heavy and tractor-trailer truck drivers; and light and delivery service truck drivers) made up 15.5 percent of all injuries and illnesses with days away from work.

Among these 11 occupations, heavy and tractor-trailer truck drivers had the largest percent increase in injures and illnesses from 2004 to 2005 (3.7 percent), while laborers and material movers had the largest increase in the number of cases. Light and delivery service truck drivers saw a 13.5-percent decline in the rate of injuries and illnesses.
