
Some occupation groups have a higher percentage of injuries and illnesses than their share of employment would imply.

Transportation and material movers account for 6.1 percent of employment, far below their 20.5-percent share of injuries and illnesses.

Management, business, and financial workers; professional workers; sales workers; and office and administrative support workers have a lower share of injuries and illnesses than their employment share would suggest. Management, business, and financial workers account for 14.4 percent of employment, but only 2.3 percent of injuries and illnesses.
