HUNTING AND FISHING LICENSE REVENUES TOP \$740 MILLION

The latest hunting and fishing license sales figures, released today by John Turner, director of the Interior Department's U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, indicate revenue from these sales rose approximately 4.5 percent in 1989. The number of people buying hunting licenses decreased slightly from the previous year; however, fishing license sales held steady.

A total of 15,858,063 people bought hunting licenses in fiscal year 1989, compared with 15,918,522 during fiscal year 1988. Fishing license purchasers numbered 30,302,244 in fiscal year 1989, compared with 30,182,544 in 1988. Income from sales of licenses and associated permits, tags, and stamps in 1989 reached an overall total of \$740 million, compared with the previous total of \$710 million.

"By purchasing licenses, America's hunters and anglers willingly do their fair share to preserve our wildlife resources, and everyone benefits," Turner said.

Money from the sale of fishing and hunting licenses, permits, tags, and stamps is used to fund state fish and wildlife programs. These license sales figures are compiled

annually by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service from information submitted by state fish and wildlife agencies. State funding through the Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration and the Federal Aid in Sport Fish Restoration programs, both administered by the Service, is determined in part by the number of paid fishing and hunting license holders in each state.

License sales figures tend to fluctuate from year to year for a number of reasons, such as initiation of a special permit, stamp, or tag; price increase; or new regulations governing resident and nonresident licenses or seasonal licenses. For this reason, the total number of hunting and fishing licenses, permits, tags, and stamps sold does not always reflect an actual trend in hunting or fishing activity, but may be attributed to changing state license requirements.

An indication of trends in participation is best measured through a comparison of the numbers of paid license holders (first column in the tables attached) from year to year. These figures provide a general approximation of fishing and hunting activity in each state. However, the figures do not necessarily reflect the actual number of hunters and anglers in the country because some states offer license exemptions to people in special circumstances, such as those who are over or under a certain age, handicapped, or who hunt or fish on their own land. Also, some states sponsor special "free" hunting and fishing days, and persons who hunt or fish in more than one state are counted more than once.

A state-by-state breakdown of 1989 hunting and fishing license sales figures is attached.
